# Building and Construction Industry (State) Award [AN120089 – NSW]

Published 21May08

This pay scale summary was developed by the Workplace Authority and is derived from the above award as it was on 26 March 2006 as adjusted by the Australian Fair Pay Commission. This summary incorporates increases determined by the Australian Fair Pay Commission with effect commencing from the employee's first pay period on or after 1 October 2007.

Inquiries about the application of the Australian Fair Pay Commission's decision should be referred to the Workplace Infoline on 1300 363 264.

#### **Coverage**

This pay scale summary applies in the State of New South Wales to the employment of:

- (a) persons engaged on construction work;
- (b) painters and signwriters employed in a painting or signwriting shop by an employer whose principal business is in the building and construction industry who in addition to carrying out on-site construction work also operates a painting and/or signwriting shop; and
- (c) builders' labourers.

Provided that this pay scale summary shall not apply to any builder's labourer employed solely assisting any plumber, or employed by a plumbing contractor on plumbing work.

This pay scale summary shall not apply to employment by an employer in any industry where work performed by the employee is subsidiary or auxiliary to the chief and principal purposes and business of such industry.

#### **Exceptions**

Provided that this pay scale summary shall not apply to the following:

- (a) The making of implements of agriculture.
- (b) The work of ship carpenters or ship joiners or of seagoing carpenters on articles or ship painters or ship signwriters or ship grainers or ship gilders.
- (c) Employees classified in this pay scale summary who are employed by a mixed enterprise in a maintenance and/or ancillary capacity.

- (d) Employees working in the County of Yancowinna.
- (e) Employees whose rates of pay and conditions of employment are regulated by any pay scale derived from the Crown Employees (Skilled Tradesmen) Award
- (f) Employees of an employer who is respondent to the pay scale derived from the National Building and Construction Industry Award, 2000;
- (g) Employees of Public Hospitals in New South Wales.

For detail of the coverage provisions see the 26 March 2006 version of the award.

### **Wages**

The basic periodic rates of pay in this pay scale summary have been adjusted in line with the Supplementary Decision issued on 30 May 2007 by the Full Bench of the Australian Industrial Relations Commission (AIRC) in the Wages and Allowances Review 2006 – [2007] AIRCFB 439.

No existing employee's rate of pay shall be reduced as a result of the introduction of the new classification structure.

#### Frequency of payment

Payments shall be paid and available to the employee not later than the cessation of ordinary hours of work on Thursday of each working week. Provided that in any week in which a holiday falls on a Friday wages accrued shall be paid on the previous Wednesday and provided further that when a holiday occurs on any Thursday wages accrued may be paid on the following Friday. Nothing shall prevent any alternative mutual arrangement between an employer and an employee.

Note that the frequency of payment provisions in this pay scale summary do not apply to employees who are covered by a workplace agreement or contract of employment containing frequency of payment provisions that provide for payments in respect of periods of one month or less. Such employees are guaranteed payment in accordance with the frequency of payment provisions in the workplace agreement or contract of employment.
