ORDER:-

In the G.O. first read above, the Government have approved the guidelines for admission of students in B.Ed., courses in Government / Government Aided / Self Financing Colleges of Education under single window system. The Tamil Nadu Self Financing Colleges of Education Management Association and 3 others have filed WP No.24910, 25177, 25187, & 24159 of 2007 before the High Court of Madras, challenging the clauses relating to reservation of seats, selection and counselling by single window system and Government quota in the colleges of education in the guidelines issued in the G.O. first read above. The High Court of Madras in its order dated 17.8.2007 in the above WPs has set aside Clause IV (a) (iii) and Clause IV (d) of the Annexure to G.O. first read above, in respect of allocation of seats to the Government from the Colleges of Education; and selection by Single Window System respectively in so far as they relate to the Unaided Colleges of Education both minority and non-minority. The High Court of Madras has made clear that in cases of the Unaided Private Educational Colleges, who desire to surrender the seats based on the agreement, this judgement shall not stand in its way. The point relating to reservation is not decided and the issue is left open as the petitioners are willing to follow the reservation in admission. It is made clear that in any event if sufficient number of candidates are not available under the reserved category, it is open to the Private Unaided Educational Colleges to fill up the said seats as open category. The High Court of Madras had also given certain other directions to unaided colleges of Education / Government.

2. Against the above judgement of the Division Bench of High Court of Madras, the Government have filed SLP No.23471, 23472, 23473 & 23474 / 2007 which were later converted as Civil Appeal No. 8505, 8506, 8507, 8508 / 2010, before Supreme Court of India. The Supreme Court of India in its orders dated 10.3.2011 has dismissed the civil appeals. Therefore orders of High Court of Madras dated 17.8.07, WP No.24910, 25177, 25187, & 24159 of 2007 prevail as on date.

3. In the G.O. second read above guidelines for admission of students in Government / Government Aided / Self Financing Colleges of Education for the year 2012-13 were issued.

4. In the letter third read above the Director of Collegiate Education has stated that a committee was established for framing of guidelines for admission of students to colleges of Education, headed by the Director of Collegiate Education and comprising of the Joint Director (Planning & Development), Joint Director (Finance) and Principals. The committee have decided that the guidelines issued for admission of students to Government / Government Aided and Self Financing Colleges of education for the year 2012-13 may be followed for the year 2013-14 also. She has requested the Government to issue necessary orders in this regard.

5. The Government after careful consideration have decided to accept the proposal of the Director of Collegiate Education. Accordingly, they direct that, guidelines issued for admission of students in Government / Government Aided / Self Financing Colleges of Education for the year 2012-13 as indicated in the annexure to this G.O. be followed for the year 2013-14 also.

GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO B.Ed. COURSES FOR THE YEAR 2013-14

(Government / Government Aided / Self-Financing Colleges of Education)

I **Subjects offered under B.Ed Programme**

1. The following optional subjects are being offered under B.Ed Course in Government/Government Aided/Self-Financing Colleges of Education.

P.G. Degree holders only can opt for subjects mentioned against Sl.Nos. 11 to 18.

2. Actual Subjects offered in each college and number of seats available will be notified at the counselling centre.

II **Eligibility and Educational Qualification**

- (i) The candidates should have undergone 10+2+3(15) or 11+1+3 (15) pattern of study and passed the qualifying examination conducted by the respective State Board or CBSE or any other recognized Board of Education/Examination and U.G. Degree examination of the UGC recognized Universities in any one of the school subjects offered by the Directorate of School Education at the Secondary / Higher Secondary Education level.

- (ii) Candidates who have passed the U.G. or P.G. degree in Open University System without qualifying in 11 years SSLC examination and 1 year of Pre-University Course (P.U.C.) examination or 10+2 pattern of School Education examination **shall not be** considered for admission.
- (iii) Candidates who have taken more than one main subject in Part III/ Part IV (under Double/Triple Major System) of U.G. Degree course should have to choose only one of the main subjects and should have applied for that Optional only. In such cases, marks obtained by the candidates in Two / Three major subjects shall be taken into account to arrive percentage of marks as stipulated in item (viii).
- (iv) Candidates who have passed under Additional Degree Programme with less than three years duration **are not eligible** for admission.
- (v) Candidates who have passed under four year Dual Degree Programme with two major subjects under Part III are not eligible for admission.
- (vi) Candidates who have qualified in P.G. Degree (5 year Integrated Course) under 10+2+5 or 11+1+5 pattern of study shall be considered for admission. In such cases, the marks obtained by the candidates in the PG shall be taken into account for admission to the B.Ed. Degree Course.
- (vii)
 - a) Candidates who have done their U.G. degree in Applied Mathematics can apply for Mathematics.
 - b) Candidates who have done their U.G. degree in Applied Physics, Geo-Physics, Bio-Physics and Electronics can apply for Physical Science.
 - c) Candidates who have done their U.G. degree in Bio-Chemistry and Applied Chemistry can apply for Physical Science.
 - d) Candidates who have done their U.G. degree in Bio-Technology and Plant-Biology and Plant Biotechnology can apply for Biological Science.
 - e) Candidates who have done their U.G. degree in Environmental Science and Micro-Biology can apply for Biological Science.
 - f) Candidates who have done their U.G. degree in Applied Geography can apply for Geography.
 - g) Candidates who have done their UG Degree in Computer Science, Information Technology, Computer Application. etc., can apply for Computer Science.
 - h) Post Graduate candidates in Economics, Commerce, Home Science, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Logic and Indian Culture with 50% (irrespective of their UG marks) of marks in PG Degree or in the interdisciplinary subjects which are being declared equivalent by the respective University can apply.
 - i) The candidates qualified in PG Degree and secured 50% of marks with the same major subjects in UG Degree but not fulfilling the minimum percentage of marks required in UG Degree as per community / category-wise will be eligible.

- j) Candidates who have done their PG Degree in Nutrition and Dietetics are eligible to apply for Home Science.
- k) Candidates who have done their UG in the school subjects are eligible for admission to B.Ed. However, those who have done the UG in the subjects not covered under this G.O shall have to obtain an equivalence certificate for the respective subjects from the concerned Universities to consider their admission to B.Ed Degree Course. The decision of the University shall be final in this regard.
- l) Candidates who have done their U.G. level without language Tamil or other Indian Languages under Part-I and are awarded degree with English and Main subjects concerned need to be considered for admission to B.Ed subject to the condition that they have to qualify in Tamil Language Test conducted by the TNPSC for the purpose of employment.
- viii) Candidates with the following marks in the Bachelor's Degree are eligible for admission to the course other than Economics, Commerce, Home Science, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Logic and Indian Culture subjects for which PG qualification is mandatory.

Note: (a) Marks obtained by the candidates in the U.G. Degree Course Part III/IV Major and Allied including Practical (other than subjects Economics, Commerce, Home Science, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Logic and Indian Culture) alone shall be taken into account to arrive at the percentage of marks mentioned above.

- a (i) Marks obtained by the candidates in UG Degree under part IV- Elective / Allied / Extra Disciplinary Subjects shall also be taken into account to arrive at the percentage of marks mentioned above. Marks obtained under Part V subjects shall not be taken into account to arrive percentage of marks
- b) Marks obtained by the candidates in P.G. Degree (other than Economics, Commerce, Home Science, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Logic and Indian Culture) shall not be considered for admission.
- c) To arrive at above percentage of marks, the marks obtained by the candidates in Major/Ancillary/Allied/Extra Disciplinary Subjects (Part III & IV) including practicals alone shall be taken into account.

- d) Rounding of marks to the next higher Integer shall not be permitted.
- e) The candidates who have qualified in Bachelor's Degree under Open University System after passing 10th std. and +2 examinations shall alone be considered for admission to B.Ed Degree Course.
- f) The Candidates who have qualified in Bachelor's Degree under Open University System without passing 10th and +2 examinations and subsequently passing 10th and +2 examinations are not eligible for admission to B.Ed Degree Course.
- (IX) Candidates who have passed P.G. Degree in Economics, Commerce, Home Science, Political Science, Sociology, Psychology, Philosophy, Logic and Indian Culture without undergoing 10+2+3 or 11+1+3 pattern of education **shall not be** considered for admission.
- (X) In the case of Physically and Visually challenged candidates, a minimum pass in the Degree is enough.

However, the basis of selection shall be in accordance with the Regulations of the University / Government of Tamil Nadu Guidelines for admission to B.Ed. Course in force from time to time.

- III 1. **Reservation of seats** for candidates belonging to BC, MBC/DNC, SC and ST communities will be made as per the rules and regulations of the Government.
 - i.e i) In the 18% for Scheduled Castes (S.C.). 3% of seats will be offered to Arunthathiyars (within the seats for S.C.).
 - ii) Scheduled Tribes (S.T.) - 1%
 - iii) Most Backward Classes (MBC) and Denotified Communities (DNC) – 20%
 - iv) Backward Classes (BC) -30%, within this 3.5% for Muslims and
 - v) Open Competition (OC) – 31%
- 2. Admission into every College of Education shall be made strictly by following the rule of reservation as per law in force including the Management quota seats of Non - Minority Aided Colleges.
- 3. For the wards of Ex-Servicemen of Tamil Nadu origin, one seat will be reserved in each College of Education.
- 4. 3% of the sanctioned strength will be reserved for physically and Visually Challenged students in each College of Education. 5 seats are exclusively allotted for Visually Challenged candidates in two IASEs and five Government Colleges of Education.

IV Selection and Admission Procedure under Single Window System

a) Allocation of seats in the Colleges of Education.

Seats in the Colleges of Education are grouped into the following categories.

- i) Seats in Government Colleges of Education (100% of seats Government quota)
- ii) Seats in Government Aided Colleges of Education (50% of seats in Aided minority Colleges and 90% of seats in non-minority Aided Colleges as Government quota).

b) Method of Application

- i) Accurate information about the percentage of marks is essential. The candidate is totally responsible for any incorrect information and incorrect percentage of marks.
- ii) Candidates are advised to take a Xerox copy of the coding sheet and fill up all the information correctly before filling the original coding sheet.
- iii) A candidate needs to submit only one application for B.Ed., Course seeking admission to Government, Government Aided Colleges of Education. The cost of application is Rs. 300/- In the case of SC/ST candidates the cost of application is Rs. 175/- on production of attested Xerox copy of the Community Certificate. The cost of application must be paid either in cash or in the form of Demand Draft drawn from any Nationalised Bank / Scheduled Bank in favour of "The Secretary, Tamil Nadu B.Ed. Admission, Chennai", payable at Chennai.

c) Last Date.

1. i) Last date for receiving the filled-in application in person or by post will be notified in the advertisement.
- ii) Application not received on or before the due date, not in the prescribed form, not correctly filled up or do not otherwise fulfill the terms of the instructions will be considered defective and are liable for rejection without notice. The candidates alone is responsible for any delay in receipt of application sent by post. No correspondence will be entertained in this respect.
- iii) Candidates will have to produce all the Original Certificates at the time of counselling for verification and admission or at any other time as required by the authorities. Selection will not be made if they do not produce the relevant documents at the time of counselling for verification.

2. i) The Candidates belonging to Tamilnadu only will be considered for communal reservation. Candidates seeking admission against SC, SC Arunthathiyars ST/MBC/DNC/BC Muslim, BC others quota should obtain the Certificate of Social Status in the prescribed permanent Community Certificate / Card of Tamilnadu and that should be produced at the time of Counselling.
- ii) The ST candidates should obtain the Community Certificate only from the Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO) of their native place or Collector of their District.
3. Candidates have to send the filled in applications (coding sheet) along with the community certificate as 'loose sheet' to "The Secretary, Tamilnadu B.Ed Admissions, Lady Willingdon Institute of Advance Study in Education, Chennai – 600 005"

d) **Selection and Counselling**

1. The Selection of candidates will be on the basis of the marks secured in the qualifying UG/PG Degree examination.
2. i) Candidates will be called for counselling in the order of their rank. Based on the rank and communal reservations, allotment will be made to the college and optional subjects that are available in the respective college at the time of counselling. Candidates other than SC/ST have to submit a Demand Draft for Rs. 2000/- and Rs. 1000/- in case of Tamilnadu SC/ST candidates as "Initial Payment" drawn in favour of "The Secretary, Tamil Nadu B.Ed. Admission, Chennai", at the time of counselling. Candidates should submit all original certificates when they come for counselling.
- ii) Once the candidate is allotted a seat, the amount of Rs. 2000/- for other communities and Rs. 1000/- in case of SC/ST in (Tamilnadu) already paid at the time of Counselling will be adjusted towards the tuition fees that has to be paid to the respective allotted college.
3. i) The date, time and venue of the counseling will be intimated to the individual candidates by post and through the press / media. No request for change of date/time of counselling is permissible.
- ii) Candidate will not be considered for selection if he/she fails to (i) report at the specified time and date for counselling, (ii) bring all the certificates in original.
- iii) The candidates have to join the colleges to which they are allotted within the time notified in the Admission order, failing which, the seats will be deemed to have fallen vacant. No request for reconsideration of admission thereafter shall be entertained.
4. The provisionally selected candidates in the counselling will be directed to report for admission to the institution specified in the admission order. Candidate has to report within the specified date with all the certificates in original and must be ready to remit the fees as directed in the allotted college.

5. The provisional selection of the candidate will be cancelled, if he/she fails to
- i) report within the specified time limit at the allotted college, ii) produce original certificates, iii) remit the fees required to be paid at the college and such allotted seat will be filled by other candidates as per ranking list.

V. Rank Listing.

1.
 - i) The percentage of marks obtained by the candidate in major and allied subjects (both in Theory and Practical) in all three years in the UG degree will be taken as the base mark for ranking.
 - ii) Candidates who have taken more than one main subject in Part III (under Double/Triple Major System) of U.G. Degree course should have to choose only one of the main subjects and should have applied for that optional only. In such cases, marks obtained by the candidates in Two/Three major subjects shall be taken into account to arrive percentage of marks as stipulated in item II (viii).
 - iii) Candidates who have qualified in P.G. Degree (5 year Integrated Course) under 10+2+5 or 11+1+5 pattern of study shall be considered for admission. In such cases, the marks obtained by the candidates in the first three years (in major and ancillary or allied subjects alone) of the course alone shall be taken into account for admission to the B.Ed. Degree Course.
 - iv) In case of determination of inter-se-merit of candidates with the same marks in the ranking, final ranking of candidates will be declared from the following in the order of merit.
 - a. Marks scored by the candidate in the Major subjects.
 - b. Marks scored in Allied -I Subject
 - c. Marks scored in Allied-II Subject
 - d. By random method
2.
 - i) Weightage for the highest qualification of the candidate will be given as follows and added to the base mark for the Ranking. However minimum mark mentioned in the Para II (viii) is mandatory.

Candidates with PG	- 4 Marks
Candidates with M.Phil	- 5 Marks
Candidates with Ph.D.	- 6 Marks
 - ii) The higher qualification for which weightage will be given should be in the same subject studied as the main subject in part III of the UG degree and preferred as optional subject in B.Ed. course.
 - iii) Weightage of 3 (three) marks for participation in any one of the following co-curricular activities will be added:
 - a) NSS certificate (with two years enrolment in N.S.S. and ten days participation in the Special Camp at College level alone will be considered).
 - b) N.C.C (B or C Certificate at college level).
 - c) Sports (should have represented the college at state /National Level).

VI Important Instructions

All the entries in the application form and coding sheet should be written legibly by the candidate. The candidate should ensure that all information including the marks in the qualifying examination furnished by him/her in the application form and the coding sheet are correct. Any incorrect details furnished in the application form and coding sheet will result in the candidate's selection being cancelled.

VII Physical Fitness Certificate

Candidates selected will have to submit a certificate of physical fitness obtained from a Government Civil Surgeon / Civil Assistant Surgeon within the specified date. Otherwise his/her selection will be cancelled.
