INTRODUCTION

This Booklet gives you detailed information about the competitive examination for recruitment of Probationary Officers in State Bank of India. This post was advertised in the Employment News/Rozgar Samachar issue dated 19-25 April, 2014 and on the Bank's website www.statebankofindia.com and www.sbi.co.in. The terms and conditions, **period of probation**, emoluments etc. were given in the advertisement No. CRPD/PO/2014-15/01. You should ensure that you are eligible in respect of age, educational qualification, nationality as stipulated in the advertisement.

This handout contains details pertaining to various aspects of the online examination you are going to take and describes the kind of test which will be given to you in the examination. The assessment will be done online for the objective tests followed by a Descriptive Paper which will be through offline (paper-pen) mode. The method of indicating answers for objective tests have been give in (III) and for Descriptive Paper have been given in (IV) hence you should carefully read instructions regarding the method of indicating answers. You are advised to study this booklet carefully as it will help you in preparing for the examination.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Particulars to be Noted: Please note carefully your Roll Number, date, time and venue for the examination given in the call letter.
- 2. **Punctuality in Attendance :** Candidates should be present at the examination hall at the time given in the call letter. Candidates arriving late will not be permitted to enter the Examination Hall.
- 3. Call letter to be Surrendered: Affix firmly a copy of your recent passport size photograph in the space provided for it in the call letter and bring it with you alongwith photo identity proof in original and a photocopy when you come to the venue for the examination. You will not be permitted to appear for the examination if you come without the photo identity proof in original and a photocopy, call letter or without the photograph affixed on the call letter. You will be required to sign in the space provided for candidate's signature on your call letter in the presence of the invigilator in the examination hall. Invigilator will take your left thumb impression on the call letter while collecting the same. You should hand over your call letter alongwith the photocopy of photo identity proof to the invigilator in the examination hall, when he collects the call letters from the candidates.
- 4. **Compliance with Instructions:** You should scrupulously follow the instructions given by test administrators and the invigilators at all the stages of the examination for which you have been called. If you violate the instructions you will be disqualified and may also be asked to leave the examination hall.
- 5. Use of Books, Notes, Calculators & Cell Phones: No calculator separate or with watch, cell phones, books, slide rulers, note books or written notes will be allowed inside the examination hall.
- 6. Do not leave your seat unless you are allowed.
- 7. Use of Stationery: You must bring stationery such as pencils, ball point pen with you.
- 8. Rough work to be done on the sheet provided: You should do all the necessary rough work on sheet provided only. After the online test is over, you should hand over the sheet, given for rough work to the invigilator and after the Descriptive Paper (DP) is over you should hand over the DP to the invigilator before leaving the room. Any candidate who does not return the above material or is found to attempt to take or pass on the questions or answers inside or outside the examination hall will be disqualified and the Bank may take further action against him as per rules of the Bank.
- 9. There will be Penalty for wrong answers marked by you in the objective tests. There are five alternative answers to every question of all the tests. For each question for which a wrong answer has been given by you, one-fourth or 0.25 of the marks assigned to that question will be deducted as penalty. If a question is left blank, i.e. no answer is given by you, there will be no penalty for that question. If the total of the penalty for test is in fraction, it will be rounded off to the nearest integer. You should therefore be careful in marking your answers.
- 10. Copying / Misconduct / Unfair Practices: If a candidate is/has been found guilty of
 - i) Copying or allowing copying;
 - ii) Using unfair means during the test;
 - iii) Impersonating or procuring impersonation by any person;
 - iv) Misbehaving at the examination venue:
 - v) Disclosing, publishing reproducing, transmitting, storing or facilitating transmission and storage of test contents in any form or any information therein in whole or part thereof or by any means verbal or written, electronic or mechanical or taking away the papers supplied in the examination hall or found to be in unauthoirsed possession of test content.
 - vi) Resorting to any other irregular or improper means;

- vii) Obtaining support of his/her candidature by any means.

 He/she will, in addition to rendering himself/herself liable to criminal prosecution, be liable to,
- (a) Disqualification from selection process.
- (b) Be debarred permanently/for specific period from any examination or selection by the Bank. Candidates are warned against filling up/furnishing false, tampered/fabricated information or suppressing material information.
 - The Bank would be analyzing the responses of a candidate with other appeared candidates to detect patterns of similarity. On the basis of such an analysis, if it is found that the responses have been shared and scores obtained are not genuine/valid, the Bank reserves the right to cancel his/her candidature.
- 11. Travelling Allowance shall not be paid: No travelling allowance or other expenses in connection with the examination will be paid. Please also note that the call letter does not constitute an offer of employment by the State Bank of India.
- 12. The possibility for occurrences of some problem in the administration of the examination cannot be ruled out completely which may impact test delivery and/or result from being generated. In that event, every effort will be made to rectify such problem, which may include movement of the candidates from one venue/lab/computer (node) to others and reconduct of the examination if considered necessary.

STRUCTURE OF WRITTEN EXAMINATION

Phase - I

The examination will consist of two parts – Part A and Part B. Part A would consist of Objective Tests while Part B will contain a Descriptive Paper.

Part (A) Objective Tests; Part (B) Descriptive Paper. The details of the tests are given below:

PART (A) OBJECTIVE TESTS:

Except the Test of English Language all the questions in the tests will be in Hindi and English. For these four objective type tests, you will be given a composite time of 2 Hours.

The objective test will be online. Immediately after online objective test, Descriptive test will be administered. Candidates will have to answer Descriptive test on Paper/Pen mode.

The candidates are required to qualify in each of the Tests by securing passing marks, to be decided by the Bank. PART (B) DESCRIPTIVE TEST: The Descriptive Test with 1 hour duration (50 marks) will be of "Test of English Language (comprehension, short precis, letter writing & essay)"

The candidates are required to qualify in the Descriptive Test by securing passing marks, to be decided by the Bank.

Descriptive Test paper of only those candidates will be evaluated who have scored qualifying marks in the Objective Tests and are Placed adequately high as per total marks in objective test.

Phase-II Group Discussion (20 marks) & Interview (30 marks): The aggregate marks of candidates qualifying in both the Objective Tests and Descriptive Test will be arranged in descending order in each category. Adequate number of candidates in each category, as decided by the Bank will be called for Group Discussion and Interview. The qualifying marks in Group Discussion & Interview will be as decided by the Bank.

Candidates qualifying for GD & Interview under 'OBC' category are required to submit OBC certificate containing the 'Non Creamy layer' clause. Candidates not submiting the OBC certificate containing the 'Non Creamy layer' clause and requesting to be interviewed under General category will not be entertained.

Final Selection: The candidates will have to qualify both in Phase-I and Phase II separately.

Marks secured by the candidates in the Written Test (out of 250 marks) are converted to out of 75 and marks secured in Group Discussion & Interview (out of 50 marks) are converted to out of 25. The final merit list is arrived at after aggregating converted marks of Written Test and Group Discussion & Interview out of 100 for each category.

The selection will be made from the top merit ranked candidates in each category. Results of the candidates who have qualified for Phase II and the list of candidates finally selected will be made available on the Bank's websit. Final select list will be published in Employment News/Rozgar Samachar.

Sample Questions:

Below are given some sample questions for each of these tests. The type of questions are only illustrative and not exhaustive. In actual test you may find questions on some or all these types and also questions on the type not mentioned here.

Reasoning (High Level)

This is a test to see how well you can think and also to judge your aptitude/ knowledge for working with computer. It contains questions of various kinds. Here are some sample questions. Directions: In each of the following questions, there are five letter groups or words in each question. Four of these letter groups or words are alike in some way, while one is different. Find the one which is different. Q.1. (1) black (3) green (2) red (4) paint Of the five, 'black, 'red', 'green' and 'yellow' form a group as they are names of colours. 'paint' is not the name of a colour. Therefore, (4) is the answer. Now try to solve the following questions. Q.2. 

There may also be problems in the form of figures, designs and drawings. These may be of three types viz. (1) analogies, (2) classification and (3) series.

1. Analogies (I):

Try the following analogy type questions.

Directions: In these questions, there are two sets of figures. The Problem Figures and the Answer Figures. The Problem Figures are presented in two units. The first unit contains two figures and the second unit contains one figure and a question mark in place of the second figure. You have to find out which one of the Answer Figures should be in place of the question mark.



Look at the first two Problem Figures. The second figure is related to the first figure in a certain way. The elements in the second figure are double the elements in the first figure. The first figure is one square and the second figure is two squares.

The third and fourth figures should have the same relationship as the first and the second have. That means the fourth figure should be double the third figure. The third figure is a circle; so the fourth should be two circles. Answer figure 5 has two circles. Therefore, the answer is 5.

Study the first and the second figures in the first unit of the Problem Figures. The first figure is made up of three lines and the second figure is made up of four lines. That means the second figure has one line more than the first figure.

The third figure in the second unit has four lines. Therefore, the fourth figure should have five lines. You will find that figure 1 is made up of five lines. Therefore, the answer is 1.

Now attempt the following question.



Analogies (II):

In each of the following problems a related pair of figures is followed by five numbured pairs of figures. Select the pair that has a relationship similar to that in the original pair. The best answer is to be selected from a group of fairly close choices.

Now study the following problems.



In the problem figure, the right hand element of the figure is related to the left hand element of the figure in a certain way. The right hand element has one side more than the left hand element. The pair in the Answer figure No. 5 has the same relationship i.e. the right hand element of the figure has one side more than the left hand element of the figure. Therefore, '5' is the answer.



In the problem figure, the right hand element of the figure is related to the left hand element of the figure in a certain way. Both the elements are rectangles, but the right hand element is horizontal while the left hand element is vertical.

In the answer figure 2, both the elements of the figure are straight lines. The right hand element is horizontal while the left hand element is vertical. Therefore, (2) is the correct answer.


2. Classification:

Study the following questions based on classification.

Q.18. Problem Figures


In classification, the Problem Figures themselves are also the Answer Figures. Out of the five figures, four are similar in a certain way. One figure is not like the other four. That means four figures form a group. The question is which one of the figures does not belong to this group?

For example, look at the Q. No. 18. Of the five figures, four are straight lines whereas one is a circle. The four lines form a group. The circle does not belong to this group. Therefore, the answer is the circle which is figure 1.




Study the five figures. The first four figures form a group as they represent living beings while the fifth figure, the triangle, does not represent a living being. Therefore the answer is 5.

Now attempt the following question.



3. Series (I)

Study the following problems based on series.




Note that the five figures given first at the left are called Problem Figures. The five figures given next are called Answer Figures. They are indicated by numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5.

The five Problem Figures make a series. That means they change from left to right in a specific order. The question is 'If the figures continue to change in the same order, what should the sixth figure be? In the example above, as you go from left to right, you find that the line across the Problem Figures is inclining towards left.


The question is, 'if the line continues to incline further, what will be its next, i.e. sixth position?' The answer would be it would fall further and be lying flat, ie. it will be horizontal.

Answer Figure 4 has a line lying horizontal. Therefore, the answer is 4.



Study the position of the dot in all the Problem Figures. Note that it keeps moving around the square in the clockwise directions. Where would it be next in the sixth position? It would come back to the upper left corner. Therefore, the answer is 2.

Now solve the following questions.




3. Series (II)

In each of the following problems, a series is established if the positions of the two out of five numbered figures are interchanged. The position of the first unnumbered figure remains the same. It is the beginning of the series. The earlier of the two numbered figures whose positions are interchanged is the Answer. If it is not necessary to interchange the positions of figures to establish the series, write 5 as your answer. Remember that when the series is established, the figures change from left to right (i.e. from the unnumbered figure to the last figure), in a specific order.

Now study the following problems:

Q.25.



In this problem, a series is already established. It is not necessary to interchange the positions of any two numbered figures. Therefore, mark (5) as the correct Answer.

Q.26.



In this problem a series is established by interchanging the positions of figures (4) and (5). Therefore, Mark (4) as the correct Answer.

Data Analysis and Interpretation

This test is designed to measure how fast and accurate you are in dealing with numbers, viz. computation, quantitative reasoning, interpretation of tables and graphs etc.

III. Details about On-line Test Pattern:

- 1. A **login screen** will be displayed to the candidate. The candidate has to log in using his/her User ID and Password which will be provided in the examination hall.
- 2. After logging in Candidate's profile (Name, Roll No. & photograph etc.) will be displayed and the candidate has to confirm the same by clicked on the 'I confirm' button confirming the profile is correct.
- 3. Thereafter the instructions will be dispalyed on the screen.
- 4. A candidate should read the instructions carefully and indicate that he has done so by 'checking' (click) the box at the bottom of the screen, after which the 'I am ready to begin' button is activated.
- 5. After clicking on the 'I am ready to begin' button the actual **test time** will begin.
- 6. There are 200 questions and each question is followed by 5 alternatives/options.
- 7. The total marks for the test are 200.
- 8. The questions except those on English Language will be available in Hindi and in English. In order to view a given question in the other language, a candidate can click on the 'view in' drop down box and select the desired language.
- 9. Only one question will be displayed at a time.
- 10. In order to answer a question, the candidate has to 'mouse click' the option he/she thinks is appropriate/ correct.

 The alternative which has been clicked on will be highlighted and shall be treated as the answer given by the candidate for the question.
- 11. After selecting an answer for a question the candidate should click on the 'SAVE & NEXT' button to save his answer and proceed to the next question. Note that without clicking on 'Save & Next' button the answer selected for a question will not be saved.
- 12. In case a candidate does not wish to attempt the question then he/ she should not click on any option for that question. A candidate can choose to deselect his/her answer for a particular question by clicking on the 'CLEAR RESPONSE' button provided against each question.
- 13. In case a candidate wants to skip a particular question and return to it later before submitting his/her test or a candidate 'clicks' (selects) an answer for a particular question but wishes to review it later, he/she may note down the question number on the sheet provided.

In such cases the candidate may also click on the 'MARK FOR REVIEW & NEXT' button. In case an answer has been selected for a particular question which has been marked as 'MARK FOR REVIEW & NEXT', the answer marked will be taken for final evaluation.

- 14. The question numbers of attempted and unattempted questions are also shown to the right of the screen. A candidate can then click on any of the question numbers to view the question, in order to attempt/ revise his/her answer to the question.
- 15. Each question number will be displayed in a particular colour depending on the status of the question:

White: Not visited: Question has not been viewed/attempted

Red : Not Answered : Question has been viewed but not answered

Green: Answered: Question has been answered

Violet: Marked: Question has been marked for review later

- 16. Candidates are not permitted to submit their answers before the entire test time i.e 120 minutes is over.
- 17. A candidate can navigate between questions by clicking on the question number displayed to the right of the screen.
- 18. When a candidate clicks on a particular question, it takes some time for the question to appear. The time lost is not deducted from the total time allotted for the test.
- 19. Under no circumstances should a candidate click on any of the 'keyboard keys' once the exam starts as this will lock the exam.

About the Submission

- 1. Candidates are not permitted to submit their answers before the entire test time is over.
- 2. A candidate can only change his/ her answer before clicking the 'Submit' button.
- 3. After the expiry of the exam duration, candidates will not be able to attempt any question or check their answers. A candidate's answers would be automatically saved by the computer system even if he has not clicked the 'Submit' button.

IV.

The objective test will be online. Immediately after online objective test, Descriptive test will be administered. Candidates will have to answer Descriptive test on Paper/Pen mode.
