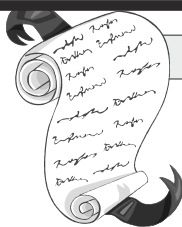

# ACADEMICS AT TJIS

Life long learning is the cornerstone of academic planning and activities at TJIS. Teaching, learning and assessment are all intertwined to foster a learning environment. We strongly believe that learning takes place best when the learner discovers facts and ideas rather than being taught. To this end, a lot of emphasis is placed on inquiry training across all stages of the curriculum.

The curriculum focuses on integration of knowledge from all spheres. Teaching-learning methods are geared to stimulate creative thinking, critical thinking and problem solving skills. The learner has to discover and integrate academic knowledge in relation to the real world causing holistic learning. Some of the unique features of academics at TJIS are:

## **Assessment Under CCE up to Class X**

Since its inception, the School has been following the grading system for assessment of a student wherein students were given grades rather than marks and the overall performance of the student was calculated on the basis of his entire year's performance and not only the year – end examination. The School now follows the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) system of Assessment as laid down by the CBSE for Classes I to X.

Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) refers to a system of school based evaluation of a student that covers all aspects of a student's development. The scheme attempts to cover both the scholastic and the co-scholastic aspects of the student's growth and development.

Scholastic aspects include curricular areas or subject specific areas, whereas Co-Scholastic aspects include Life Skills, Co-Curricular Activities, Attitudes and Values, etc..

## **PART I: Academic Performance: Scholastic Areas**

The students are assessed on subject specific areas which include:-

1. Language I – English
2. Language II – Hindi (For Classes I – VIII) & Hindi / Sanskrit (For Classes IX & X)
3. Language III – Sanskrit (Only for Classes V – VIII)
4. Mathematics
5. General Sciences / Environmental Science (EVS) [For Classes 1 & 2], and
6. Social Studies / Social Sciences.

Each Academic Year is divided into two terms. The First Term will be from April –September and the Second Term from October-March of the subsequent year. Assessment will be both Formative and Summative.

**Formative Assessment** is a tool used by the teacher to continuously monitor a student's progress. It involves regular descriptive feedback, a chance for the student to reflect on the performance, take advice and improve upon it. Formative Assessment is carried out during a course of instruction for providing continuous feedback to both the teachers and the learners. Various tools and techniques can be used to assess students formatively. It includes Class Test, MCQ Test, Unit Test, Class work, Home work, observations, orals, presentations, projects, assignments, quizzes, debates, extempore speeches, etc.

**Summative Assessment** is carried out at the end of a course of learning. It measures or 'sums-up' how much a student has learned from the course. It is usually a graded test, i.e., it is marked according to a scale or set of grades. There will be two Summative Assessments, one each at the end of each term.

- ✓ Each term will have two Formative and one Summative Assessment.
- ✓ Assessment will be indicated in Grades.
- ✓ The Grading Scale for the Scholastic Areas is a Nine Point Grading Scale.

#### **REMEDICATION AND MICRO TEACHING**

Students who require additional support in academics, attend remedial classes in the subject. During these classes, focus is on helping students gain clarity over certain concepts/topics taught in class through individual attention, re-teaching/revision exercises that help enhance their learning. In these classes, worksheets are prepared on specific topics, by each subject teacher, which the students have to solve and get corrected by the teacher during the same period. Thereafter a student corrects his mistakes in order to gain perfection in the topic/concept.

#### **TEACHING METHODS & TEACHING AIDS**

The most ultra modern methods are adopted in teaching & learning. This is done, by exposing students to learning by doing projects, assignments, practical problem solving, field trips, educational tours, life skills training, workshops, seminars, etc. Classrooms equipped with the latest technology makes teaching - learning fun at TJIS. Students are encouraged to use the internet and the vast resources of Reference Books and Educational CD's available in the school library.

## CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Co-Curricular activities form an integral part of the curriculum at TJIS, providing opportunities for students to develop their particular hobbies and interests in several fields. The daily time table includes time for activities such as Swimming, Music, Dance, Art/Craft, Drama and Handwriting classes ensuring that the students grow into versatile learners with varied interests.

### CLUBS

Students of classes I to VIII are given the opportunity to participate in one club of their choice. The clubs function on every Saturday. A student must choose a club and be a member of it for the whole term. At the end of this duration the student can change to any other club of his / her liking. The Clubs include – Pottery / Craft, Clay Moulding, Public Speaking / Debate, First Aid Training, Gardening, Vegetable & Fruit Carving, Science, Music, Dance, Creativity, Calligraphy and Web Designing.

### SPORTS

Sports play an important role in the development of a sound mind in a sound body. Students have regular access to sports such as Cricket, Swimming, Volleyball, Throw ball, Football, Lawn Tennis, Table Tennis, Basket ball etc. Students are also exposed to various Inter - House and Inter - School competitions. Regular Yoga and Meditation classes are also held to strengthen physical fitness and the power of concentration.

### CLASS TEACHER'S PERIOD (CTP)

Every Wednesday's 7<sup>th</sup> Period is CTP. During this time Class Meeting, Mentor Meeting, Classroom Soft boards, debates, declamation, etc. are organized. This provides the class teacher an opportunity to interact with the class.

Parents are invited to visit the Class / Subject Teachers, Head Mistress, Coordinators & Principal during the CTP to discuss and get a feedback of their ward's academic progress.

### PARICHAY PROGRAMME

This is a unique Achiever's meet programme wherein students get the opportunity to interact with and listen to eminent personalities from different walks of life. These eminent personalities share their achievements and experiences which helps in igniting the young minds to work towards achieving their goals.

### MENTORING

Each student in the school is put under the responsibility of a mentor teacher. The mentor is in regular touch with his/her mentee and keeps record of the student's activities - academic as well as co-curricular. During mentor meetings the students are free to interact with their mentors, share their problems, if any, and get their Mentor's guidance and support. The mentor also keeps in touch with the parents to give and receive a feedback of the student.

## GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

2. Taking food in school is optional. All those who opt, not to take food provided by the school, may bring home prepared vegetarian food. Please do not send Junk food as meals for your child's tiffin.
3. In case an extra set of uniform or textbook(s) is needed, a written requisition in the prescribed format has to be submitted and payment made at the finance. The same can be then collected from the stores.

If the fees are not paid on time, a fine of ₹ 50 per day will be charged.

6. Parents must not enter any class room or the corridors without permission of the Principal except during Class Teacher's Period on Wednesday.
7. Please ensure that your ward does not bring any money, eatables, electronic items or valuables to the school unless specified by the school. If found, the same will be confiscated. The school will also not be responsible for the loss of any such items.
8. Parents are requested to co-operate & comply with the time specifications for Parent - Teacher Meet & other school functions. By being punctual & regular, you will be setting an example for the children as well.
9. The school administration reserves the right to rusticate / expel a student from the school:-
  - a. who in the opinion of the Principal is not likely to benefit from continuing his/her education at the school.
  - b. whose conduct is considered detrimental to other students in the school.
  - c. whose fees is not paid within the stipulated period.
  - d. if the Parent's behaviour & attitude is harmful to the school and its students.
10. All requests to school by the parent must be through an application to the Principal.  
**Parents must take an appointment by calling the school reception desk, to meet the Principal on any day except during the CLASS TEACHER'S PERIOD.**

# CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

## 1. Dress Code -

- 1.1 **School Uniform:-** All students must come to school in their *School Uniform* from *Monday to Friday*. The school uniform includes a Grey Trousers (For Boys) / Divided Skirt (For Girls), a blue check shirt, the school Tie & Belt, the school Shoes & Socks.
- 1.2 **Sports Dress:-** On *Saturday*, students must come to school in their *Sports Dress* which includes the *Navy Blue School T-shirt* and the *Navy Blue Shorts / Lowers* (For Boys)/ *Skirt* (For Girls upto Class 7)/ *Track Suit Lowers* (For Girls of Classes 8 - 12) along with the school socks and shoes. During Winters, the school Track Suit can be worn.
- 1.3 The uniform can be purchased on the payment of the requisite fee at the School Finance. A check list will be available at the Finance. The school stores will arrange to issue the same.
- 1.4 Students must come to school in their *House T-Shirt and Navy Blue Sports Shorts / Skirt* on the day they have *Sports / Swimming period*.
- 1.5 Students must wear on their House T-shirts (Colour) while participating in any Inter - House sports activity. **Students are not permitted to play any game in their school uniform.**
- 1.6 Students must wear on their **Ceremonials (Blazer)** for all school functions, which includes School Annual Day, National Days and other events that are specified during the academic year.
- 1.7 On birthdays, children from Class 7 onwards must come to school in their School Uniforms only. Students up to Class 6 can wear on casual clothes on their birthdays.
- 1.8 During winters, only the School Grey Pullover or the School Blazer is to be worn. No student should wear any other pullover or the upper jacket of the school track suit.
- 1.9 The responsibility for neatness and appearance of the students rests with individual students and parents.
2. **Attendance and Punctuality**– On entering the campus, it is assumed that the students will attend all classes as per the timetable. With regards to this, please note the following -
  - 2.1 Arriving to the school on time is the individual Student /Parent's responsibility. Students must be present at the time of attendance. If a student comes late to school he / she must bring an application along, signed by the parent / guardian stating the reason for him / her coming late to school.
  - 2.2 Penalty for latecomers follows three levels -
    1. Oral Warning
    2. Physical Drill
    3. Meeting the Principal.If the student is coming late even after meeting the Principal, he/she will be sent back home.
  - 2.3 In case, a student has to leave school early / before school ends, he / she must bring an application duly signed by the parent / guardian. Permission will only be granted by the Principal or a person duly authorised by the Principal. In case the parent / guardian cannot pick up the student an authority letter must be sent along with the person who comes to pick up the student.

## 3. Leave - Leave letters are a prerequisite if the student is absent from school.

- 3.1 In case a student will be on leave, prior approval for leave must be taken. An application in this regard is to be submitted to the Principal through the HM / Coordinators. Up to two day's leave, will be approved by the HM / Co-ordinators which will then be filed by the class teachers. For more than two day's leave the HM / Coordinators will refer the student to the Principal or a person authorised by the Principal for approval. The same must also be entered in the diary on the Leave Record page.
- 3.2 In case of an emergency / illness, the school must be informed telephonically about the same. A leave application (along with a Doctor's certificate in case of illness) must be submitted, the day the child rejoins school.
- 3.3 In case the student is on leave and misses any of the Unit Tests or Term - End Examinations, **NO RETEST** will be conducted.
- 3.4 **80% attendance** is the minimum prerequisite at the end of each term / academic year for the child to acquire eligibility for appearing in the Annual Examination/Summative Assessment. Parents are requested to discourage students from absenting.

4. **HOUSES AND STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES** – The school has 4 houses, each headed by two Captains (Boy & Girl) and two Vice Captains (Boy & Girl). Each house has a House Master / House Mistress in charge of it and assisted by House Tutors. The Four Houses are -

#### *Gunjan*



The giggle of a child. The divine sound of “OM” and the songs sung by the whispering breeze generated by the vibration of leaves “dhanak”, the song of greenery echoes in the heart of nature and creates “Gunjan”. It is the epitome of sacredness of character, sustenance, moral ethos & values, Freedom of expression, prosperity & above all cerebral peace & self actualization. Reflecting the same, natural Green is the colour which symbolizes “Gunjan”.

#### *Jhankar*



The brilliant sound of nataraja's nupura and his musical instrument produces Jhankar. This sound breaks the silence of grief and idleness and fills life with new beats of liveliness, stamina, joy, the virtue of creation and enthusiastic vigour. It enhances the vision and sense of the navarasas for a better understanding of human values and emotions, creating a complete human being. Golden yellow is the colour which symbolizes the metallic glow and sound of JHANKAR.

#### *Kalrav*



Kalrav the sweet clinking sound of groups of birds, at the break of dawn. It indicates ensuing dawn and balaravi spreads his red rays across the forehead of the horizon. Symbolizing enrichment of knowledge, hope, determination, the confidence to take challenges, and positive thinking all of which lead to unity and victory. Red is the colour of this house which represents dynamic characteristics and the echo of KALRAV.

#### *Ninad*



The eternal drumming sound of the water fall is “Ninad”. Water is the symbol of a great force which can generate energy and thrill in life. This sound is the combination of beauty, power and courage. These qualities inculcate the zeal in all young ones to find their own way to reach their destination, negotiating even the most difficult barriers in life. Blue, representing the power of water, is the colour of Ninad.

- 4.1 All students from Class 1 onwards will be allotted any one of the four houses at the time of admission and the same colour house T-shirt will be issued by the stores. No student is permitted to change the house allotted to him/her. Inter-House competitions will be conducted between these houses. All students must participate in these competitions actively.
- 4.2 The School captains that are selected include the Head Boy, Head Girl, Sports Captain, Campus Captain, Assembly Captain and the Cultural Captain, supported by their deputies along with a hostel captain.
- 4.3 All students must co-operate with the school leaders in maintaining discipline in the school.

#### **5. General instructions–**

- 5.1 **Students are strictly not permitted to come to school on two / four wheelers. If found doing so, the keys of the vehicle will be taken away and will only be given to the parent of the child and nobody else.**
- 5.2 The students are strictly prohibited from bringing the following items to school:-  
Money (except to purchase something from the stores), any eatables like non vegetarian food, chips, chocolates, etc., mouth fresheners like sweet supari, chewing gum, etc., cold drinks, Electronic goods like lap tops, cell phones, MP3/ MP4/ MP5 Players, Pen Drives, Digital & Video Cameras, Software/ Game CD's, greeting cards, slam books, etc. unless permitted by the school. These items will be confiscated if brought to School and strict disciplinary action will be taken.
- 5.3 **Girls** must come to school with their hair neatly combed into one or two **plaits / pony tails** (In case of short hair). Girls must use only **black colour clips / bands only**.  
**Boys** should have short hair neatly combed and should be shaved. Sikh boys can wear a grey Turban/Dastar. Applying hair gel and making spikes, etc. and having coloured hair is strictly prohibited.
- 5.4 Being an English medium school, it is mandatory for students to use only English in their day-to-day communication with teachers and friends on the school campus and even in the school buses.

- 5.5 Students should not bring any expensive ornaments/items like gold chains, bracelets, etc. to school. If lost, the school will not be responsible for it.
- 5.6 No Day Scholars should get “any thing” for boarders either by taking cash or kind. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those doing so, which may also lead to the expulsion of the student (s) involved.
- 5.7 Students should not be found loitering around during class time or bunking class. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.
- 5.8 Students must leave the class only with an out pass issued by the teacher coming in to the class. If for any reason the student arrives late to class, he/she must obtain a note from the teacher who granted him / her permission.
- 5.9 No student should be found getting involved in loose talk, using abusive/ offensive language, and picking up arguments or fights with others. Strict disciplinary action will be taken if found guilty, which may also lead to expulsion from the school.
- 5.10 **No student should cause any physical damage to School Property.** If found guilty, he / she is liable for strict disciplinary action against him / her, which may include a Financial Fine or even Suspension or Expulsion from School.
- 5.11 Whenever a child comes to school for any **official work**, he / she must be in his / her **School Uniform/ Sports Dress**.
- 5.12 Any student involved in any serious act of indiscipline will be referred to the School Discipline Committee which is formed at the beginning of the academic year. The decision of the committee is binding on the students and parents are requested to kindly support the school in the same.

## 6. TRAVELLING BY THE SCHOOL BUS:

- 6.1 **DISCIPLINE**:- Every student must be disciplined in the bus and at all times bear in mind the following:-
- \* Be polite and courteous.
  - \* Respect all teachers and fellow students.
  - \* Sit down at one place without moving around or playing.
  - \* Be ready to share a seat and adjust with others.
  - \* Do not argue and/or fight with one another.
  - \* Do not tease others.
  - \* Report any problem or dispute to the Route/Transport In-charge.
- 6.2 **PUNCTUALITY**:- Every student must be present at his / her pick-up stop at least 5 minutes before the bus arrives. Please do not ask the bus driver or conductor to wait. Anyone regularly late or delaying the bus will be warned first, following which he/she will be left back the next time onwards, for which the school will not be responsible.
- 6.3 **EATABLES AND BEVERAGES**:-
- \* Students are strictly warned not to bring any eatables into the bus.
  - \* Chewing of gum is strictly prohibited.
  - \* On birthdays, only the distribution of chocolates is permitted when the bus has stopped.
  - \* Students are allowed to bring along only water and no other beverage. Playing with water or being up to mischief will lead to disciplinary action against them.
  - \* Parents must not board any school bus. In case of any problem, parents can speak to the Route In-charge or call the Transport In-charge during the working hours.
  - \* Any indiscipline on the part of the student will attract disciplinary action against him / her. Even after three warnings if the student does not show any improvement, he will then not be allowed to travel by the route bus and necessary travel arrangements will have to be made by the parents.

# RULES & REGULATION FOR HOSTEL STUDENTS & PARENTS

## **HOSTEL VISIT & REPORTING BACK TO SCHOOL**

The School Diary is self-explanatory about all Holidays/Vacations, Night outs, Dussehra / Diwali Vacations, etc..Reporting dates for hostellers after holidays/vacations are also very clearly mentioned. Parents & Students are expected to follow the schedule as far as reporting back to school after vacations is concerned.

**However, if a student does not report back on time for reasons what-so-ever, it is compulsory for the parent to accompany the student back to school, only during school hours after taking a prior appointment to meet the Principal.**

**In case a child returns back late due to medical reasons, a medical certificate must be accompanied along with the leave application when the child returns, in the format given in the Information Booklet for Parents of Boarders.**

**NOTE** - Parents who are not able to make it on the days of Night outs, may visit their wards once in a month (without disturbing the School routine), with prior permission of the Principal. **No parents to meet their ward after 05.00 pm on any day.**

## **FUN & FROLIC**

The school will organise outings and other fun activities from time to time to create light moments and interactive sessions for the students under the supervision of the Hostel Warden / Matron. Expenditure for the same will have to be borne by the parents.

## **LAUNDRY SYSTEM**

The school extends the laundry facility for the convenience of students. The laundry facility is available throughout the week. Mentioned below is the laundry quota per student.

## **LEAVE**

Leave cannot be claimed as a matter of right and its approval is at the sole discretion of the Principal.

Leave may be granted on the occasion of the marriage of real Brothers/Sisters or on the demise of any immediate family member such as- Parent, Grand Parent or First Cousins. Please also note that a request for leave will only be entertained in written, fax or by email addressed to the Principal who is the approving authority. The e-mails must to be sent to – warden@tjisedu.in (For Boys) & matron@tjisedu.in (For Girls).

Students will not be permitted to go home during local holidays nor will leave be granted for Family Poojas / Grah Pravesh (House Warming)/Birthdays or any other personal reason.

## **VACATIONS**

Please refer to the school diary for the dates of the vacations. While going on vacations, students must take all their belongings and leave their bed box and cupboard empty. Students can also submit their belongings to the Hostel Warden in a locked suitcase or an air bag.

## **FINE OR PENALTY**

A fine of Rs. 1,000 per day will be charged from Boarders, if prior approval of leave is not taken. The day the student rejoins school, the fine has to be paid and a leave application along must be submitted.

The student(s) who damage any School property will have to pay a fine in lieu of the damage. If the actual offender is not Identified then the penalty will be divided among the students involved in such an activity.

Boarders are strictly prohibited from bringing the following items to school:-

Money, any eatables like non vegetarian food, chips, chocolates, etc., mouth fresheners like sweet supari, chewing gum, etc., cold drinks, Electronic goods like lap tops, cell phones, MP3/ MP4/ MP5 Players, Pen Drives, Digital & Video Cameras, Software/ Game CD's, greeting cards, slam books, etc. A penalty of Rs. 5,000/- will be levied in case a student is in possession of such items. The penalty amount would be doubled in case the mistake is repeated.



### PHONE CALL

Students can bring simple mobile phones without multimedia facility in them and the same should be submitted to the Warden/ Matron. They will be allowed to call from their mobile phones only on Sundays & Holidays under the supervision of the warden/ matron.

### PARTICIPATION IN VARIOUS CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

It is compulsory for students to participate in all Hostel & School activities. The child may have to go out for various competitions, NCC, Sports, etc. **If a parent has any objection then a written application has to be submitted to the school authority. The Parents will have to bear the expenses incurred on their ward.**
