INTRODUCTION

Included in this packet is the application for admission to Yeshiva University's undergraduate schools—Stern College for Women, Yeshiva College and Sy Syms School of Business, as well as application supplements for those seeking admission to the S. Daniel Abraham Honors Program at Stern College, the Jay and Jeanie Schottenstein Honors Program at Yeshiva College or the Sy Syms Business Honors and Entrepreneurial Leadership Program. Applicants may file a paper application but are encouraged to apply online at www.yu.edu/admissions. Applicants are requested to express interest in either the liberal arts and sciences (Stern College or Yeshiva College) or in business (Sy Syms).

Please read all instructions carefully and answer the chosen essay question thoroughly. It is your responsibility as an applicant to follow through on the application process. Applicants may check the status of their applications, which will be updated online weekly at www.yu.edu/admissions. Feel free to keep in touch with the Office of Admissions and other University offices. The Office of Admissions can be reached at 212.960.5277, 9 a.m.–5:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday, and until 2:30 pm on Friday.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

Candidates may apply at any time after completion of their junior year in high school, but should apply no later than February 1 of their senior year for admission for the September following graduation. A limited number of applicants may apply to start Yeshiva University immediately after their junior year of high school in our Early Admissions Program. Please see page 5 for more details. Of importance in determining a student's qualifications for admission are the high school scholastic record, SAT I (and SAT IIs, if available) or ACT scores (and results of statewide tests such as the New York State Regents Examinations), essay and personal interview. The applicant's character, personality and contribution to school and community life are also factors in the admission decision.

The transition to Yeshiva University is facilitated by visiting the campus. Faculty, students and staff enjoy engaging prospective students and their families in discussing university life, and student hosts are available to show applicants around campus. Applicants unable to come to the NY campus may arrange with the Admissions Office to meet with local alumni and current students. It is the prospective student's responsibility to arrange for either an on-campus or local interview. Please call the Office of Admissions at 212.960.5277 to schedule an appointment, following submission of the complete application.

The University offers an extensive range of state, federal and University-based grants, as well as loans and work-study programs to create a financial aid package which meets individual financial needs. University financial aid officers work with students and parents to help make YU affordable. To be considered for the full range of available financial aid, students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. This is available after January 1 of the calendar year for which admission is sought and should be completed before March 1.

Students demonstrating exceptional overall academic achievement and commitment to Jewish and general studies may apply to the S. Daniel Abraham Honors Program at Stern College, the Jay and Jeanie Schottenstein Honors Program at Yeshiva College or the Sy Syms Business Honors and Entrepreneurial Leadership Program. Applicants to the honors programs are also considered for academic scholarships. See "Honors Program Candidates" on page 13 for information.

The University is committed to a policy of equal opportunity and nondiscrimination in admission and all other facets of its educational programs and activities. The University encourages applications from qualified students regardless of sex, religion, age, race, handicap, color or national origin, within the meaning of applicable law.

FRESHMAN APPLICATION (NORTH AMERICAN STUDENTS)

A candidate for admission as a freshman should present a minimum SAT I score of 1100 (critical reading and mathematics), minimum high school average of 85 and a recognized academic diploma.

- Application: Complete the application form, including all required essays, and submit it along with the \$65 application fee.
- **Transcripts:** All transcripts, both high school and college (if applicable), must be submitted by the school(s). Transcripts submitted by the applicants are not considered official. A student who attends a Jewish high school should submit a Jewish studies transcript as well.
- Standardized Tests: All U.S. and Canadian candidates must take either the Scholastic Assessment Test (Yeshiva University's code is 2990) or American College Testing Assessment (code 2992) and arrange to have scores submitted directly to the Office of Admissions.
- Interview: It is the candidate's responsibility to schedule an interview by calling the Office of Admissions at 212.960.5277. Applications will only be considered complete after an interview has been conducted and all supporting documentation has been received.
- **FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid):** Fill out and submit all financial aid information at www.fafsa.ed.gov, even if you have not yet been admitted, in order to be considered for financial aid upon admission.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

In order to be considered for admission, an applicant must be in good academic standing at his/her current university and have maintained an average of B or better for courses to be considered for credit.

- Application: Complete the application form, including all required essays, and submit it along with the \$65 application fee.
- **Transcripts:** All transcripts, both high school and college, must be submitted by the school(s). Transcripts submitted by the applicants are not considered official. A student who has attended a Jewish high school should submit a Jewish studies transcript as well.
- Course Evaluation: In order to evaluate college courses and have them considered for transfer credit, the student must submit syllabi and course descriptions for all courses taken. Please note that your course work can only be evaluated for transfer of credit once you have submitted the official transcripts, course descriptions and syllabi, and may not be completed by the time you register for classes if it is not received by the application deadline. All documents must be officially translated into English.
- Standardized Tests: All U.S. and Canadian candidates must take either the Scholastic Assessment Test (Yeshiva University's code is 2990) or American College Testing Assessment (code 2992) and arrange to have scores submitted directly to the Office of Admissions. The main criteria for admissions are the critical reading and mathematics sections.
- Interview: It is the candidate's responsibility to schedule an interview by calling the Office of Admissions at 212.960.5277. Applications will only be considered complete after an interview has been conducted and all supporting documentation has been received.
- FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid): Fill out and submit all financial aid information at www.fafsa.ed.gov, even if you have not yet been accepted, in order to be considered for financial aid upon admission.

EARLY ADMISSION

A candidate seeking admission to Yeshiva University after his or her junior year in high school may apply for early admission. Candidates must present an average of 90 and a combined score of 1270 in critical reading and mathematics on the SAT I exam or its ACT equivalent.

- Complete all components required for freshman admission.
- Applicants are required to submit a letter of recommendation from their principal or college guidance counselor in support of the Early Admission application.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- **Application:** Complete the application form, including all required essays, and submit it along with the \$65 application fee payable to Yeshiva University in U.S. dollars.
- Transcripts: All transcripts, both high school and college if applicable, must be submitted by the school(s). Transcripts submitted by the applicants are not considered official. A student who attended a Jewish high school should submit a Jewish studies transcript as well. All transcripts and copies of certificates qualifying the applicant for admission to university that are not in English or Hebrew must be officially translated into English and sent directly to the Office of Admissions (for more information, please visit www.wes.org). The student is required to submit results of any and all exit exams taken upon completion of the foreign high school (i.e., Baccalaureat, Bagrut, etc.).
- Course Evaluation: In order to evaluate college courses and have them considered for transfer credit, the student must submit syllabi and course descriptions for all courses taken. Please note that your course work can only be evaluated for transfer of credit once you have submitted the official transcripts, course descriptions and syllabi, and may not be completed by the time you register for classes if it is not received by the application deadline. All documents must be officially translated into English.
- Standardized Tests: The SAT I or ACT is required for international students applying from Canada. International students must take the TOEFL if either of the following two criteria apply: 1) he or she is a citizen of a non-English speaking country, or the student's first and/or dominant language is not English; or 2) he or she has resided in the United States for less than three years and the student's first and/or dominant language is not English. Yeshiva University requires a minimum score of 84 on the Internet-based test, to include a minimum score of 21 in both reading and writing. Scores must be submitted directly by the testing service (code 2990). For information on the TOEFL, visit www.toefl.org.
- Interview: It is the candidate's responsibility to schedule the interview by calling the Office of Admissions at 212.960.5277. Interviews are conducted at our New York and Israel offices, via Skype or with a local representative where possible. Applications will only be considered complete after an interview has been conducted.
- Letters of recommendation: Two letters of recommendation are required; preferably one from a teacher and another from a clergyman.
- Financial aid: International students in need of financial assistance must fill out the International Undergraduate Student Financial Aid Application, which is available at www.yu.edu/osf, or through the Office of Student Aid (212.960.5399).
- Student Visa: International students, who do not have U.S. citizenship or permanent residence, should not arrive in the U.S. until after they have received their Form I-20 Certificate of Eligibility from the International Student Adviser. An application for the Form I-20 is available online at http://www.yu.edu/student-life/resources/international/resources/.



Sy Syms Business Honors and Entrepreneurial Leadership Program



Yeshiva University awards a number of extraordinary students entry into the Honors Programs based on past achievement, leadership potential, and community service. Candidates for the Honors Programs are automatically considered for highly competitive academic scholarships, and acceptance to the Programs and scholarship awards are determined by the Honors Committee. Committee members take into account students' high school GPAs, standardized test scores, essays, letters of nomination, extra-curricular activities, personal interviews, and leadership potentials.

The S. Daniel Abraham Honors Program at Stern College for Women was founded in 1999 with the goal of enhancing the college experience of high-achieving students. Built on the premise that outstanding scholars should be brought together, challenged, and encouraged to excel, the program nurtures students and helps them grow intellectually and personally through academic and extracurricular opportunities. The academic program stresses writing, critical analysis, research, and individual mentoring, with honors courses offered in the humanities, Jewish studies, natural and social sciences, and as interdisciplinary seminars. In their final three semesters, honors students complete a senior project under the guidance of a faculty mentor. Each semester, the Honors Program's extracurricular events include speakers, leadership workshops, and exciting outings to operas, plays, museums, and other cultural destinations. Students who complete the Honors Program have the honors distinction noted on their transcripts and diplomas.

WHO SHOULD APPLY

Applicants who

- are applying directly from high school or who are engaged in post-high school study in Israel and will be attending college for the first time. (Transfer students from other colleges are not eligible.)
