Medical Coding/Billing Career Path

Employment of medical records and health information technicians is expected to increase 18 percent through 2016, faster than the average for all occupations. Rapid technology advancements create the need for trained professionals with the knowledge to code, bill, and correctly document the performance of these procedures and to pass potential audits by federal, as well as private, insurance payers.

What is a Medical Coder/Biller?

Medical coders and billers are part of the larger field of health information management and help with:

- Patients' health information (medical history, symptoms, examination results, diagnostic tests, treatment methods, and all other healthcare provider services)
- Health information data, ensuring quality, accuracy, accessibility, and security
- Communicating with physicians and other healthcare professionals to clarify diagnoses or to obtain additional information
- Assigning a code to each diagnosis and procedure by using classification systems that determine the amount for reimbursement to healthcare providers if the patient is covered by Medicare, Medicaid, or other insurance programs

ICD-10 is Coming!

- ICD-10 will not be implemented until Oct. 2015.
- ICD-10 is a radically upgraded diagnostic and procedural medical coding system and will be mandated by the federal government for use in the healthcare industry in insurance processing, reimbursement and statistical data gathering.
- Take the required medical terminology prerequisite course now to prepare for the fall Anatomy and Pathophysiology for Medical Billers/Coders course and January coding courses.
- Coding courses will continue to focus on ICD-9. Training will cross-walk you through the ICD-10-CM & PCS code sets along with the ICD-9-CM codes.
- Courses, led by instructors with relevant field experience, will include approximately 500 plus hours of instruction to prepare students to be successful in the industry as well as the national certification exam given by the American Academy of Professional Coders (AAPC). After passing the exam, candidates earn the credential, Certified Professional Coder (CPC).

Courses to Complete

Strong computer and keyboarding skills plus internet access are required. For more information about our computer and keyboarding courses, go to page 12. You must also have thorough knowledge of medical terminology, human anatomy and pathophysiology of diseases, regulations that govern the practice of medicine, and how to correctly code and bill for services provided. Register for one or all classroom courses and complete the series in 3-10 months. All courses are offered in sequence during fall, winter, and spring. Coding courses that will be offered this fall are offered for students who have successfully completed prerequisite courses during the winter and spring of 2014, or have passed the challenge exams. For further study, one or more prerequisite courses may be required.

- **Prerequisites:** Medical Terminology (held Aug Oct) and Anatomy and Pathophysiology for Medical Billers/Coders (held Oct Dec) are required before taking coding courses. Take the required medical terminology prerequisite course now to prepare for the fall Anatomy and Pathophysiology for Medical Billers/Coders course and coding courses beginning January 2015.
- **Medical Insurance Billing A-Z Plus** may be taken at any time and will help you seek employment while taking the coding courses.



Certified Nursing Assistant: Theory and Clinical

As a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), you are on the front lines of patient care and provide critical services. This course, approved by the Maryland Board of Nursing, provides the training you need to effectively care for people in a variety of health care settings. You must successfully complete both Theory and Clinical sections to receive your certification. Please register for both at the same time. To take the CNA course, you must:

- Be 18 years or older and have a high school diploma or GED, social security number, complete immunizations (reviewed in class), and pass a criminal background check.
- Pass basic reading and math exams before registering. (Allow two hours to complete the test). Call Kathy Krasney at 443-518-4919 to schedule an appointment and identify yourself as a CNA student (current photo ID required for testing). You must take the test and register at least one week before the class start date.

When you complete the CNA course, you will be wellprepared and eligible to take the State Geriatric Examination (\$95 exam fee) to become a Geriatric Nursing Assistant (GNA). A free GNA review class is offered to CNA students.

AGE REQUIREMENTS: Anyone 16 or older may register on a first-come, first-served basis. Students under 16 may take noncredit courses listed for their age group under "Kids On Campus."

TUITION: Tuition must be paid in full at time of registration. Each tuition includes a built-in \$40 nonrefundable registration fee.

- In-county tuition for noncredit students is based on verification of Howard County residency. Additional criteria may be necessary for students taking credit courses.
- Out-of-county Maryland residents taking noncredit courses pay stated tuition plus \$10 per course.
- **Out-of-state residents** pay stated tuition plus \$20 per course.

Students who do not pay all course charges may be sent to a collections agency and will be responsible for additional fees as well as the original charges. They will not receive certificates and are ineligible to continue at HCC.

TUITION WAIVERS: Tuition is waived for students 60 years of age or older legally residing in Maryland. Waiver applies only to tuition, not to fees. If you qualify for the waiver, you only pay any fees listed in the course description. All courses with "XE" designations are not eligible for tuition waivers. Tuition waivers for students with

ACCOMMODATIONS FOR PEOPLE WITH DIS-ABILITIES: HCC is committed to providing an accessible education and supportive learning environment for all students. To help us meet this goal, all students with disabilities who require special accommodations must notify the Division of Continuing Education, in writing, two weeks before their first class begins so that we may provide suitable assistance. All information will be kept confidential.

IDENTIFICATION CARDS: Students who pay \$125 or more in noncredit tuition and fees for the current semester are eligible for a student ID card for that semester. ID holders will be admitted during the current credit semester to the athletic center and weight room and receive discounts to some Horowitz Center events.

- To Get an ID Card: Bring an official College letter or receipt showing your College ID number and payment of \$125 or more for the current semester to the Security Department on the first floor of the RCF Building.
- To Request Access to the Library & Open Computer Labs: ID holders should call 443-518-4646. You will be asked to show your student ID when using the facilities.

Lost ID Cards: There is a \$25 fee to replace lost cards.

OTHER PASSES: Any Howard County resident can purchase six-month, one-month, and day Athletic Center passes at the Cashier. The handicapped entrance on the side of the Athletic and Fitness Center requires a special card. If you need access, please notify the Division of Continuing Education & Workforce Development in writing two weeks before the first class. The Athletic and Fitness Center will provide a special access card, valid until the class session is over. The card must be returned at the end of the class session.


