

# **ADMISSION INFORMATION**

Each school has admission criteria. If a school receives more applications than places on offer, we will explain how they will be allocated.

# Admission number and previous applications

This is the total number of pupils that the school can admit into Reception (or Year 3 for Junior Schools). We have also included the total number of pupils in the school so you can gauge its size. The number of all preferences and first preferences will also help you to see how oversubscribed a school is, as this will tell you how many parents had named a school as one of their preferences on their application form and how many of these had placed it as their first preference.

# Admission policy

Admission policies are set by the admission authority for the school (the Local Authority for Community & Voluntary Controlled Schools and the Governing Body for Free, Foundation, Academies & Voluntary Aided Schools) and are applied for new children entering a school. We have included the most important aspects of each schools admission criteria so you are aware before applying for a school place. This will include whether the school has a supplementary information form

that you may need to complete and how to obtain this. The complete version of each school's admission policy is available from www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/ schooladmissions, the school itself, the school's website, or by contacting the Admissions and Transfer Team. The admission policy for all Community and Voluntary Controlled schools can be found on page 8.

# Oversubscription criteria

If a school receives more preferences than places available, the admission authority will place all children in the order in which they could be considered for a place. This will strictly follow the priority order of their oversubscription criteria. Next to each criteria we have identified how many children were offered a place at the school for that reason for September 2014. We suggest you read the oversubscription criteria to see how many children were offered places last year, for all of the schools that you are considering as your preferences, to assess how likely it is that your application will be successful. We can't quarantee your child will be offered one of their preferred schools, but they will have a stronger chance where they meet higher priorities in the criteria.



# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

# Children with Special Educational Needs (SEN)

The Children and Families Bill, expected to be in force by 1st September 2014, proposes a number of changes to the current practices and processes, including a new SEN Code of Practice. It is expected that Governing Bodies of ALL types of schools and settings will be required to admit pupils with statements of SEN or Education, Health and Social care Plans, where a particular school or setting is named, even if that school or setting is full.

As at present, this will be subject to certain conditions being met.



Parents and carers of children with either a statement or an EHC Plan can contact their SEN Casework Officer for further advice and support.

This guidance will be updated in light of the Children and Families Bill when it is enacted.

# In-year fair access protocols

Gloucestershire County Council has protocols in place to ensure that Admissions and Transfer is secured quickly for children who do not have a school place and that schools have an equitable spread of vulnerable children or those who are hard to place. All schools in Gloucestershire, including the Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools encompassed by these admission arrangements, have signed up to the fair access protocols and if a vulnerable child within these protocols requires a place at school, they will take precedent over any child on the waiting list.

# Sibling definition

The admission criteria for Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools offers a higher priority for children with siblings who will still be attending the school when the applicant child is admitted. (Sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner as well as children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership). In every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address.

# Twins and children from multiple births

Applications for twins and children from multiple births will be considered as individual applications. However, the Local Authority acknowledges the difficulties for families if children cannot attend the same school, for example if one child can be offered a place but not the other and therefore will aim to accommodate both/all children at one school where there is capacity to do so.

This includes overriding the Key Stage 1 restructions which limit Reception, Year One and Year Two classes to a maximum of 30 children per teacher, if the one child from twins/multiple births can be offered a place when the other(s) cannot.

# Oversubscription criteria

Where a school is oversubscribed (i.e. there are more applications than places available) initial applications will be made in accordance with their admission criteria.

Late applications received up to 4 weeks before allocation day will be considered after on time applications. If we are able to make a reasonable offer we will do so and you will receive notification on allocation day. If we are unable to make a reasonable offer your application will be considered during our reconsideration round along with any late applications received within 4 weeks of allocation day.

# Waiting lists

If you have not been allocated your preferred school/academy after reconsideration, your child will automatically be placed on the waiting list. If a place becomes available and your child is next on the waiting list we will contact you to see if you would like the place. Waiting lists will follow the admission criteria for each school/ academy and children may move up and down as places are offered or new children with higher priority under the admission criteria join the list (e.g if a new child moves into the area close to the school/ academy they will join the waiting list higher than children living further away, even if they have been on the waiting list for longer).

Waiting lists are kept until December 2015 or longer depending on the school/academy (as stated in the school's/academy's admission policy).

# **Appeals**

Where an application for a place at your preferred school is unsuccessful, following the reconsideration stage, you do have the legal right of appeal. For Community and Voluntary Controlled schools the appeals procedure involves completing and returning an appeal form which can be downloaded from www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/ schooladmissions. For a paper copy, please contact the A&T Team. Your case will be decided by an Independent Appeal Panel at a meeting to which you will be invited. The Panel's decision is legally binding on all parties, and can only be challenged if the procedure was not followed correctly. The appeals will usually be held between May – July.

If a place is required at a Free, Foundation, Trust, Academy or Voluntary Aided school you will need to contact the school directly to request appeal paperwork.

# Community and Voluntary Controlled schools

# Primary and Infant schools

Where applications for admission exceed the number of places available, the following criteria will be applied, in the order set out below, to decide which children to admit:


- Children in Public Care (Looked After Children).
- 2. Children who will have siblings attending the school at the time the applicant child is admitted.
- 3. Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey address point of the child's home address (including flats) to the ordnance survey address point of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

Where points 1 and 2 are oversubscribed, criterion 3 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 3 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Local Authority. This is a manual process which is overseen by an independent person from the Legal Services & Monitoring Team.









### Junior schools

All Community and Voluntary Controlled junior schools use the following criteria to admit children into Year 3:

Where applications for admission exceed the number of places available, the following criteria will be applied, in the order set out below, to decide which children to admit:


- 1. Children in Public Care (Looked After Children).
- 2. In the case of companion infant and junior schools, priority will be given to pupils attending the companion infant school.
- Children who will have siblings attending the school at the time the applicant child is admitted.
- 4. Children who will have siblings attending the companion infant school at the time the applicant child is admitted.
- 5. Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey point of the child's home to an ordnance survey point of the school/academy, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving the higher priority.

Where any particular category at points 1-4 above is oversubscribed, criterion 5 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child is offered a place.


In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 5 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Local Authority. This is a manual process which is overseen by an independent person from the Legal Services & Monitoring Team.

# SCHOOL LOCATION MAPS




### Map 1 Primary Schools - Cheltenham Borough




# Map 2 Primary Schools - Cotswold District



### Map 3 Primary Schools - Forest of Dean





## Map 4 Primary Schools - Gloucester City



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# A-Z of schools

## **Criteria Definitions**

### Children in Public Care (Looked After Children)/previous Looked After Children

A 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence, or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).

An adoption order is an order under section 46 of the Adoption and Children Act 2002.

A residence order is an order settling the arrangements to be made as to the person with whom the child is to live under section 8 of the Children Act 1989. Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 defines a 'special guardianship order' as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian (or special guardians).

### **Sibling**

Unless otherwise stated in the individual school criteria sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner as well as children who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership. In every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address. The older child must be continuing to attend when the younger child is admitted.

In the case of infant schools unless otherwise stated in the school criteria a sibling connection is also established if an older child will be or is already attending the companion junior school

### Admission Policy for September, 2015 (No. of pupils admitted in 2014 shown in brackets)

- 1. Children in Public Care (Looked After Children).
- 2. Children who have siblings attending the school and who will continue to do so when the younger child is admitted. For this purpose, sibling refers to brother or sister, half brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner, and in every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address. (13)
- 3. Children living in the Ecclesiastical Parish of Holy Trinity Church Amberley. A map showing the parish boundary is available for viewing in the school office. **(0)**
- 4. Children of parents who are regular members of Amberley Church congregation. We define regular members as parents who attend Holy Trinity Church, Amberley at least once a month for twelve months to be verified to the governors in writing by members of Amberley Church Council. (<5)
- 5. Children for whom only one particular school is appropriate due to an exceptional medical condition. Applications under this criterion will only be considered if they are supported by a written statement from the child's doctor which must demonstrate that there is a very specific connection between the medical need and the facilities or resources of the school. **(0)**
- 6. Children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the Ordnance Survey Address Point of the School to the Ordinance Survey Address Point of the applicant's home using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving higher priority. **(0)**

Where any particular category at points 1-5 is oversubscribed, criterion 6 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be use to determine which child will be offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 6 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Governing Body.

In the event of the school being oversubscribed a Waiting List will be held for the first term, i.e. until the December break. The Waiting List will be prioritised according to the school's oversubscription criteria. The school has signed up to the In-Year Fair Access Protocols and Equality Impact Assessments held by the Local Authority. Should a vulnerable child within these Protocols require a place at the school, they will take precedence over any child on the Waiting List.

We define a family to be active members of the church if the family attends church at least 6 times a year. A letter of support from the minister will be required. (0)
- 6. Children of families who live outside the above parishes. (0)

In the event of over-subscription in any of the categories above, places will be offered to children with the strongest geographical claim, measured in a straight line from the ordnance survey point of the child's home address (including flats) to the ordnance survey point of the school, using the Local authority's computerised measuring system, with those living closer to the school receiving higher priority.

Where any particular category at points 1-6 is over-subscribed, criterion 7 (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child will be offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion 7 where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Governing Body.

### Admission Policy for September 2015 (No. of pupils admitted in 2014 shown in brackets)

- 1. i) The highest priority is given to looked after children and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order.
  - ii) Location: Where the family live in the ecclesiastical parishes of Dymock (including Ryton), Preston, Donnington and Kempley.\* (A map showing these parishes is available from the school.)
- 2. Children who have brothers or sisters attending the school and who will continue to do so when the younger child is admitted. A "sibling" is defined as a brother or sister, half-brother or sister, adopted brother or sister, step brother or sister, or the child of the parent's/carer's partner, and in every case, the child must be living in the same family unit at the same address." (5)
- 3. Denomination: Where the parents or guardian seek specifically Church of England teaching, and where the family has an active connection with their local church. In this case, a letter of reference is required from the priest –in charge, confirming that the parents and child attend regular worship and are involved in the church community. Regular worship is defined as attending at least two services per calendar month. The letter should be sent to the Chair of Governors at Ann Cam C of E Primary School by 9th January 2015. (0)
- 4 Other denominations or faiths: Where the family have an active connection with another denomination or faith. As in c) a letter of reference is required from the religious leader, confirming regular worship and involvement in the relevant faith community. Where any particular category at points a to d is oversubscribed, criterion e (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) will be used to determine which child will be offered a place.

In the event of a tie between two or more children when applying criterion e (strongest geographical claim based on straight line distance) where there are not enough places available to offer all children a place at the school, a process of random allocation will be followed by the Governing Body.
