Introduction

The following report outlines an investigation into the breadth of sexual health programming targeted toward men who have sex with men¹ (MSM) across the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS), which includes Cambodia, Lao People's Democratic Republic (PDR), Burma, Thailand, Vietnam, and Guangxi and Yunnan provinces of the People's Republic of China.

This activity was completed by the Burnet Institute, on behalf of the Health Policy Initiative/Greater Mekong Region-China (HPI/GMR-C), with a view to building the policy and advocacy platform for organizations working with MSM across the GMS for the next 2–3 years. This activity was proposed by HPI/GMR-C and agreed to by the Regional Technical Board of the Purple Sky Network (the regional network of organizations working with MSM in the GMS) during a meeting in March 2008. Each member of the Regional Technical Board was invited to contribute to the investigation's direction and, through provision of organization-specific information, its content.

The report aims to list the donors and organizations working in this programming area in the GMS with a view to eliciting directions for future advocacy. Where possible, the level of funding being directed toward HIV prevention and care activities for MSM, and the period during which those funds are guaranteed were explored. This investigation did not look into specific details of prevention, treatment, or care programs, such as availability of commodities (particularly condoms and lubricant). This is an important area for further review.

Completing the Investigation

Individuals and organizations were contacted and asked to provide information on their activities/projects, including;

- The type of intervention they were implementing (prevention, treatment/antiretroviral treatment, care and support, and/or other)
- The target group for the intervention (MSM: not identified as gay, MSM: self-identified gay, transgenders, HIV-positive MSM, male sex workers, and/or males: not only MSM)
- The donor(s)
- The level of funding
- The month in which the funding was scheduled to end (up to June 2010).

¹ This term encompasses all males who engage in male-male sexual behavior and who are homosexual or bisexual and self-identifying in diverse ways (including as heterosexuals), and transgender people.

In order to identify a diverse range of donors supporting activities for MSM, it was necessary to investigate activities of organizations beyond the predominantly USAID-funded Purple Sky Network members. Therefore, in addition to the information above, individuals and organizations were requested to identify any other organizations or donors they were aware of who were implementing/supporting activities for MSM in their countries, either through specific projects for MSM, or through wider sexual health and HIV prevention and care projects. Once identified, organizations and donors were approached for information, often leading to the identification of other organizations and donors. The process continued until saturation had been reached, as signaled by the repeated identification of previously reported projects, activities, and donors, and the failure to identify unexplored leads for further investigation.

For a full list of organizations and individuals consulted, including those from whom no response was received, see Annex A.

Results of the Investigation

A detailed listing of organizations, projects, donors, and levels of funding can be viewed in Annex B, HIV Programs and Funding in Greater Mekong Subregion by Country, and Annex C, HIV Programs and Funding in Greater Mekong Subregion by Donor. The former presents information on the GMS by country, listing the names of local organizations implementing activities, supporting international nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), government organizations/networks, and donors. The latter document presents the same information, organized by donor. Levels of funding (where supplied by respondents) and the date of conclusion of funding are also presented.

Table 1 outlines those donors known to be funding activities specifically targeted toward MSM, and the countries (or regions, if appropriate) in which they operate.

Through the course of the investigation, it was clear that a number of sexual health and HIV prevention projects/activities are being implemented, which, although not exclusively targeting MSM, do include them within their target populations. It was difficult to determine the exact proportion of the available funds that were directed toward activities for MSM. However, Table 2 outlines the donors whose activities target this group as part of more general sexual health and HIV prevention activities, such as condom and lubricant promotion and social marketing, dissemination of prevention messages, sex worker peer education, sexually transmitted infection (STI) testing and treatment, and care and support for HIV-positive people.

Some explanation is required for a number of listed activities that include GMS countries as well as countries in the region outside these boundaries. The regional United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) project will organize one or two consultative workshops for governments and organizations working with MSM in two countries in Southeast Asia, other than those included in the GMS. Thus, only a portion of the US\$50,000 allocated by UNESCO to the activity will be spent on interventions for MSM in the GMS.

Similarly, the unconfirmed, US\$100,000 for the ADB/UNAIDS Regional MSM Learning Site is for countries in the Asia-Pacific region (covering the countries from Afghanistan to Tahiti). Therefore, the extent to which this sum contributes to activities for MSM in the GMS is still undefined.

Also undefined is the proportion of funds directed to Yunnan and Guangxi provinces from the United Nations Development Programme's (UNDP's) national-level support of the development of MSM-focused national strategic plans, and participative engagement of civil society and government on issues relating to MSM and HIV in the People's Republic of China.

Analysis and Discussion

Donors

It is clear from the tables above that the main donor contributing to specific activities for men who have sex with men in each of the GMS countries/provinces is USAID. USAID funding, however, is allocated on an annual basis, and recipients cannot always rely on funds being available for long-term planning, a situation that recently left at least one Thai organization without a confirmed source of income.

Conversely, activities funded under the Global Fund generally receive a larger donor contribution than USAID-funded activities, but are for a longer, confirmed period. Yet few countries in the GMS receive Global Fund money for activities targeted exclusively toward MSM, despite the Fund's specific calls to include interventions targeting MSM in proposals. Recent Thai proposals that involve working with MSM to the Global Fund have been rejected. This may indicate weakness in the proposals and a need for technical support to improve the quality of submissions from the region. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation is notably absent on the list of donors, which may underscore the limited capacity of civil society organizations to take on large-scale programs and/or the need for scaled up advocacy with the Gates Foundation.

In developing an advocacy platform for organizations and donors who implement and/or support activities for MSM across the GMS, the challenge will be to encourage organizations to source funds from a range of donors whose funding periods ensure both short- and long-term stability.

While donor resources for activities targeted to MSM is currently small, a number of donors exist who fund HIV prevention and sexual reproductive health activities aimed at the general population. These donors have indicated that they have no restrictions preventing them from funding activities that specifically target MSM. There is clearly an opportunity to advocate with donors such as the Rockefeller Foundation, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the Ford Foundation, the Canada Fund, and international NGOs such as Oxfam, CARE, and Save the Children.

The recently released report of the Commission on AIDS in Asia, *Redefining AIDS in Asia: Crafting an Effective Response*, presents a recommendation to strongly advocate with donors, governments, and international NGOs to discourage policies, laws, and recipient selection criteria that inhibit access to funding or other resources for organizations working with MSM. While none of the identified donors in this investigation were found to have such policies or recipient selection criteria, consideration of this issue should feature in the development of future advocacy programs/projects in the GMS.

Activities and Interventions

The investigation demonstrates that a large number of activities for MSM in the GMS focus on prevention of HIV and other STIs (approximately 65 percent of identified programs/projects), while only 22 percent and 7 percent of activities deliver care and support, and treatment respectively. Likewise, the number of projects/programs reporting to deliver advocacy for MSM was low (10 percent); however, it is likely that many programs/projects indirectly contribute to advocacy while implementing their regular activities. Approximately 20 percent of projects/programs for MSM were reported to include capacity-building components.

Another recommendation of the recent *Redefining AIDS in Asia: Crafting an Effective Response* report is to ensure balanced, adequate coverage of prevention, care and support, and treatment activities targeted to those most at risk. Exactly what this balance constitutes in terms of funding activities to address the HIV epidemic in the GMS is beyond the scope of this investigation (additional HPI/GMR-C research is being conducted to explore this); however, it is evident that the number of prevention activities identified greatly outweighs the delivery of care, support, and treatment services. While it is possible that treatment, care, and support activities for MSM are underrepresented in this investigation because this target group accesses services and programs not exclusively for MSM, the tendency toward a prevention-focused approach is likely to be accurate.

Despite the higher proportion of prevention activities for MSM, it is unlikely that the requirements for effective coverage of prevention activities, as outlined in *Redefining AIDS in Asia: Crafting an Effective Response*, are being met at current levels of effort. Based on this finding, there is a clear, urgent need for scale-up of all programming for MSM in the GMS, with particular emphasis on ensuring an appropriate balance between prevention, care and support, and treatment activities.

Additionally, in accordance with the recommendations in *Redefining AIDS in Asia: Crafting an Effective Response*, there is an urgent need to provide antiretroviral treatment to those who require it in the GMS. In addition, the number of activities that are devoted specifically to reducing stigma and discrimination of MSM appear to be alarmingly few, an aspect of HIV/AIDS programming that requires immediate rectification.

Advocacy and Capacity Development

A clear recommendation of *Redefining AIDS in Asia: Crafting an Effective Response* is to promote greater political leadership and involvement of civil society organizations in mechanisms for addressing the AIDS epidemic. This can be achieved through advocacy at the regional, national, and community levels.

Regionally, there is an opportunity for UN agencies (such as UNDP, as the recently appointed lead UN agency on MSM and HIV globally, and UNESCO, which is the designated lead agency on MSM and HIV in the Asia-Pacific region) to scale-up their support to country-level processes that mobilize government and civil society in the development of National HIV/AIDS Strategic Plans that address issues specific to MSM. Political involvement in, and support to, national processes can be strengthened through advocacy from regional bodies such as the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and the ADB (for whom there is an immediate, unfulfilled need to develop their own formalized, organizational policies and commitment to expanded and intensified programming for MSM). Given that a number of donor agencies, such as the Global Fund and the ADB respond to direct requests from governments, regional-level advocacy to governments is essential to ensure appropriate resources are available to implement activities for MSM. There is an important role for regional networks and advocacy groups such as the recently formed Asia Pacific Coalition on Male Sexual Health (APCOM) and the Mekong-area Purple Sky Network in advocating with regional organizations to raise the profile and levels of funding for MSM. Indeed, APCOM has engaged with the ADB, which is now co-funding a study on expenditure and costing of prevention and care interventions in Asia and the Pacific.

At the national level, it is essential for civil society to provide meaningful input into the development and implementation of National HIV/AIDS Strategic Plans (either general plans or plans focusing specifically on MSM (as recently happened in Cambodia). There is a clear role for international NGOs to advocate for and with community-based organizations and national NGOs that represent MSM to be a part of national planning processes. Additionally, every effort should be made to ensure that this involvement is meaningful and contributory to the development and implementation of national plans that benefit MSM. For this to occur, advocacy should coincide with effective capacity development of community-based organizations and national NGOs. The investigation has revealed some excellent initiatives to promote involvement of national and community-based organizations in national planning processes, such as the initiation of the USAID-supported Purple Sky Network; however, the existing, inadequate coverage of activities for MSM in the GMS reveals that greater advocacy and capacity development is required at the national level.

Defining Boundaries

Perhaps a minor difficulty for regional advocacy efforts may lie in the nominated boundaries of the GMS. The inclusion of Yunnan and Guangxi provinces of the People's Republic of China results from the inclusion of these two provinces in USAID's funding boundaries; however, few other donors share this geographic delineation. As such, donor advocacy for organizations working with MSM will need to be focused both on Southeast Asian donors and donors responsible for activities in the People's Republic of China, which will potentially require greater effort and resources.

Limitations of the Investigation

This investigation, while conducted over a much longer period than initially envisaged, is limited by its reactive nature, relying as it did on the responses from organizations and individuals to requests for information, meetings, and documents. The investigation has the potential to be an ongoing activity, and indeed it should be if a complete, accurate census of

Summary of Recommendations for Advocacy Platform

Regional-level advocacy

- To encourage regional bodies to develop formalized, organizational policies and commitment on expanded and intensified HIV and AIDS programming for MSM
- To encourage regional bodies to advocate for national government support for national HIV/AIDS planning processes
- To discourage donor policies and recipient criteria that inhibit access to financial and other resources for programs serving MSM
- To ensure inclusion of appropriate donor agencies to benefit all GMS countries/provinces
- To monitor effectiveness of regional advocacy activities by tracking the participation of donors, governments, and organizations in ongoing initiatives

Country-level advocacy

- To ensure appropriate coverage of HIV and AIDS interventions targeted at MSM
- To ensure, where resources are limited, that those most at risk or most affected by HIV are served first
- To ensure an appropriate balance of HIV and AIDS prevention, care and support, and treatment interventions targeted at MSM
- To ensure antiretroviral treatment is accessible to those who require it in the GMS
- To ensure activities to reduce stigma toward MSM are developed and supported
- To encourage national government support of national HIV/AIDS planning processes
- To advocate for inclusion of community-based organizations and national NGOs that represent MSM in national HIV/AIDS planning processes
- To encourage capacity development of community-based organizations and national NGOs that represent MSM to facilitate their meaningful involvement in the development and implementation of national HIV/AIDS planning processes
- To support community-led efforts at community organizing and network building
- To monitor effectiveness of national advocacy activities through tracking participation of donors, governments, and organizations

projects/activities for MSM in the GMS is to be established.

The information presented here is therefore limited to the responses received from those individuals and organizations who responded to requests for input. A full list of individuals and organizations contacted can be found in Annex A.

In particular, it should be noted that responses to requests for information from organizations and individuals in Burma have been low, most likely as a result

of the competing priority of the emergency response to Tropical Cyclone Nargis, which hit Burma during the investigation period. Poor responses were also noted from organizations and individuals in Thailand. Information was triangulated to complete the investigation for Thailand.

Despite some limited responses, the information presented in Annexes B and C provide a very detailed and accurate snapshot of organizations and donors working in, or supporting, this specialized portion of the sexual and reproductive health sector.

Conclusion

Given that male-to-male sexual transmission has been identified as a major driver of the HIV epidemic in the GMS, the limited number of activities targeted toward MSM is evidence that urgent donor and government advocacy is required. In particular, the scarcity of treatment and care programs is of concern.

The recommendations presented in this report encourage greater effectiveness of activities targeted toward MSM, in order to meet and curb the AIDS epidemic, with particular emphasis on facilitating wider donor support based on developed policies and commitments specific to MSM.

A number of initiatives to encourage meaningful involvement of organizations representative of MSM in the development and implementation of National HIV/AIDS Strategic Plans in the GMS, such as the USAID-supported Purple Sky Network, should be commended. It is clear, however, that more needs to be done in this area if national plans and activities are to be truly appropriate and accessible for MSM. In particular, increased support for community-led efforts at community organizing and network building (such as APCOM and Rainbow Sky programs) that can coalesce local organizations into civil society coalitions that can more effectively and collectively represent the interests of their members at a strategic level will be critical.

This investigation into donor support and organizational involvement of activities for MSM is presented here as an initial step in the process to develop an appropriate advocacy platform for organizations in the GMS.

Ongoing tracking of donor support and participation of governments and organizations in activities targeted toward MSM should be encouraged in order to monitor the effectiveness of advocacy activities. A role may exist here for regional bodies such as the Purple Sky Network.
