- Lifting may be required for some paraprofessional positions.
- Responsible work/attendance.

Responsibilities

- Help with snack distribution and supervision.
- Work in classrooms assisting teachers with students.
- Prepare, duplicate, and/or assemble materials for teachers.
- Provide general office help, may include attendance entry into CAMPUS.
- Assist with student transportation including walking lines, adult pickup, and/or bus loading after EDL dismissal.
- Attend EDL training and staff meetings as needed.
- Other duties as assigned by the EDL site leader, building principal, or OAE staff.

Compensation

Compensation is the hourly rate as specified in the labor agreement with the Saint Paul Public Schools. All EDL employees are paid on a two-week hold back. Employment in the EDL program is at will. The school district can terminate the employment of an individual working for EDL at any time, with or without cause, and with or without notice.
