KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY



The land of *Mahabharata* and *Srimadbhagavadgita* witnessed the birth of Kurukshetra University in 1956. Situated on the plains of the river Saraswati on the western bank of the famous Brahm Sarovar, the foundation stone of the University was laid on 11th January 1957 by the Late Dr. Rajendra Prasad, the first President of India. The University which started with focus on Sanskrit and Indic Studies took a big leap forward in 1961 by transforming its initial character into a multi-faculty university. Together, the twelve faculties on the campus with 46 departments provide a mix of professional, interdisciplinary and traditional courses. New programmes in emerging areas like Defence Studies, Nano Science & Technology, Genomics, Internet Journalism, International Hospitality Business Management, Women Studies, Forensic Science, Management of Development and Welfare Services, Microelectronics and VLSI design, Printing, Graphics & Packaging, Multimedia, etc. have been added to the list of courses on offer to the learners. Accredited with an 'A' grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore, the University today enjoys a sound reputation and is eagerly sought by seekers of quality education in conformity with international standards. The University offers students from throughout the region, state and nation a world-class education by providing learning experience designed to develop intellectual abilities, as well as, social moral and ethical values.

In its commitment to quality sustenance and enhancement, the University monitors and evaluates its strategies on improving the process of teaching-learning and evaluation. To this endeavour, mechanism like regular feedback from students

and other shareholders like alumni, industry, academic peers, employers, community, etc. are actively practiced. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), constituted as per guidelines of NAAC and UGC, is functioning as a nodal body on the campus.

Research is an integral and very significant activity of the University and the faculty members are involved in it with dedication. Faculty members have been successful in bringing in large funds from various agencies like DST, UGC, DRDO, DBT, UNDP, World Bank (TEQUIP), etc. under different schemes. The numbers of FIST, SAP and TEQUIP assisted departments in the University has also increased to 15.

The University has a beautiful and quiet campus spread over 400 acres of land with sylvan surroundings and the best infrastructure available. The campus has a Centrally Air-conditioned Auditorium with a seating capacity of 2500 and a 70 mm Projector, a Senate Hall, Conference Hall, a well-developed Sports Complex (Playgrounds, Gymnasium, Stadium, Swimming Pool, Tennis Courts, Volleyball Courts, Basketball Courts, etc.), Yoga Centre, Computer Centre, Health Centre, Open Air Theatre, etc. There is a spacious and well-equipped air-conditioned Central Library fully Computerized with Internet facilities. The University at present has 23 Hostels- 10 for Boys, 1 for foreign Male students and 12 for Girls on the sprawling campus of University. Adequate and well-furnished hostel facilities exist for male and female students. The neat and clean hostel premises carry the advantage of sprawling lawns and charming flower beds. The University has received 'Green Campus of the Year 2010' Award from the World Management Congress, New Delhi.

The University is committed towards a holistic development of its students. Ample opportunities are provided to those participating in different co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Managed by the Directorate of Youth and Cultural Affairs, these activities include youth festivals at zonal, inter-zonal, inter-University and national levels as well as various other cultural activities. Five years ago the University started a unique public speaking competition for students called 'Rostrum'. This popular event attracts several hundred students as speakers on issues of societal concern and other issues of national and international concern. Students are actively associated with NCC and NSS programmes.

The University is situated in pollution-free environment at a distance of about 9 Kms from Pipli on the Delhi-Chandigarh National Highway and 4 Kms from Kurukshetra Railway Junction on the Delhi-Ambala section of the Northern Railway.

COURSE SPECIALS

B.A.LL.B. (HONS.)

The Institute started a whole time 5-Year Integrated Course of B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) from the academic session 2001-02. The eighth batch of the course shall pass out in July 2013. All admissions are made strictly according to the merit drawn on the basis of an All India Entrance Test. The Entrance Test is conducted with the aim and object to evaluate the communication skills, general awareness, analytical and reasoning ability of the candidates.

The course contents are a unique combination of Law in theory and action and other allied subjects. New emerging areas in Law, like Cyber Laws, Intellectual Property Laws, Human Rights Laws, Women and the Laws, Environment Protection Laws, Corporate Laws, etc. have been included in the syllabi.

Interactive Learning

In order to train the budding lawyers, the faculty employs a mix of learning tools aimed at providing sound conceptual knowledge and realistic situations for problem solving and decision making. Moot Courts, Practical Training in Courts, Work in Lawyers' Chambers, Tutorials, Seminars, Project Reports, Debates, Quiz Contests, etc. are inbuilt part of the course curriculum, as the performance of each student in all these is to be evaluated. In order to provide due exposure to the students and teachers, distinguished Jurists, senior Advocates, eminent Professors are invited to deliver extension lectures, conduct seminars and discussions. These programmes make law teaching not only more meaningful but practice-oriented with due emphasis on court procedures and court-craft.

Every student is required to undertake an independent project in any area of interest in each subject under the guidance of the faculty member and to prepare the Project Report for evaluation.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES

1. This Prospectus is to be used only for seeking admission to B.A. LL.B (Hons) 5-Year Integrated Degree Course for the academic session 2013-14.
2. The Prospectus and Application form can also be downloaded from the University Website : www.kuk.ac.in and D.D for Rs. 800/- (Rs. 200/- for SC/BC, Blind candidates of Haryana) in favour of Registrar, K.U. Kurukshetra must be attached with this downloaded form.
3. The candidates must read the Prospectus carefully before filling the Admission Form. Attested Photographs must be affixed on the Form.
4. Nothing contained in this Prospectus would be construed to convey sanction or cited as an authority for which University Regulations in Calendar Vols. I, II and the relevant Rules in Vol. III, alone are authentic. The scheme of examination and syllabus etc. shall be as approved by the University from time to time.
5. All information furnished by the candidate is subject to verification. In case any information is found to be fake/false, at any stage, admission of the candidate shall stand automatically cancelled. Besides the admission being null and void *ab initio* the candidate can also be prosecuted.
6. Notwithstanding the fact that the candidate has taken admission, if it is found that the candidate was not eligible; his/her admission shall stand cancelled *ab initio*.
7. **No certificates/copies are to be attached with the Application Form. The original certificates alongwith two sets of attested copies of each certificate are to be produced at the time of Counseling.**
8. In order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the University, if the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character, past behaviour and antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to any course of study in the University. The Vice-Chancellor may cancel the admission of any such student.
9. The Admission Form if sent by mail must be sent through Registered Post/Speed Post/Courier and it will be the candidate's responsibility to ensure that the Form reaches in time in the office of the Institute.
10. Late receipt of applications for Admission to the course or those which are not made on prescribed form shall be rejected and no further correspondence shall be entertained.
11. **The last date for the receipt of admission forms duly completed in all respects in the office of the Institute is June 18, 2013, upto 5.00 p.m.**
12. Any candidate, who does not receive his/her Admit Card for Entrance Test upto June 27, 2013 he/she should contact to the office of the Institute of Law, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra in person, along with two recent Passport size photographs duly attested by a Gazetted Officer or Head of the Institution last attended, on June 28, 2013 (upto 5.00 p.m.) for issuance of Duplicate Admit Card.
13. Each admitted student shall have to furnish Self Declaration by him/her and his/her Parent/Guardian as per specimen given at Annexure-IX & X that he/she was never found guilty of ragging and shall not indulge in any act of ragging. Each admitted student shall furnish his/her information as per Annexure-XI.
14. No migration or transfer will be allowed from a college to the Institute of Law and vice-versa.

15. An official **e-mail ID** will be allotted and communicated to every regular student by the concerned department/Institute for sending official communication to him/her.
16. A student should keep his/her ID card always with him/her. The same should be shown when demanded by the University officer/official.
17. The student should get issued for their vehicle after submission of copy of Registration Card to the Chief Security Officer through Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute.
18. Weekly attendance report of all students will be put on the university Website. If a student remains absent from the class for 14 days or more in a month his name will be struck off from the rolls and his/her parents will also be informed.
19. Use of Alcohol is prohibited in the University Campus. Every student must observe discipline on the Campus failing which strictly action will be taken against him/her.
20. Candidate whose result of the qualifying examination is declared late, can submit their Result Card/DMC by 12.00 noon upto one day, before the display of First, Second, Third/Final list of selected candidates in the Institute and they will be considered, subject to availability of vacant seats.
21. Merit lists and lists of selected candidates will be displayed on the Notice Board of the Institute and University website for the information of the candidates.
22. If a student fails to attend his/her classes continuously for seven days from the date of commencement of classes or from the date of admission, his/her admission shall be cancelled.
23. Due to paucity of hostel accommodation, the University may not be in a position to accommodate all the aspirants in the hostels.

Note: All legal dispute relating to admission shall be subject to Kurukshetra Courts or Courts having jurisdiction in Kurukshetra.

I ELIGIBILITY

- (a) A person who has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 standard) from the Board of School Education, Haryana or an Examination recognized as equivalent thereto, with **45% marks** in the aggregate with five subjects including the subject of English shall be eligible to seek admission in the first year of B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) 5-Year Integrated Course.
- (b) The minimum eligibility condition for SC/ST candidates is **40% marks** in the qualifying Examination 10+2 with English as one of the subjects.
- (c) The minimum eligibility condition in the case of Differently Abled candidates shall be **40% marks** in the qualifying Examination 10+2 with English as one of the subjects.
(There shall be no rounding of percentage of marks of the qualifying Examination i.e. 40% and 45% means exact percentage. Thus, 39.5 % and above does not mean 40% or 44.5% and above does not mean 45%.)

Explanation: *The candidates who have obtained 10+2 through open University System directly without having any basic qualification i.e., Matric/Secondary are not eligible for admission in the B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) 5-Year Integrated Course.*

- (d) The Course is open only to whole time students and not to employed or the self-employed.
- (e) The candidates who have appeared for the final year of 10+2 Examination in 2013 and whose results have not been declared may also apply at their own risk and responsibility subject to the fulfillment of the above- mentioned eligibility conditions on the date of counseling.
- (f) Candidates who are placed under compartment in the qualifying Examination shall not be allowed admission to the course, even provisionally.

II INTAKE, DISTRIBUTION AND RESERVATION OF SEATS (To be filled on the basis of Entrance Test-2013)

(A) Intake: 120

(B) DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS

The seats shall be distributed as under :

- (1) All India Category including Haryana : 15%
- (2) Bonafide Residents of Haryana : 85%

(70% of the seats earmarked for bonafide residents of Haryana will be reserved for the categories as mentioned at (B) below, as per State Govt. policy and remaining **30% seats** will be filled from among Haryana General Category)

(C) RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR BONAFIDE RESIDENTS OF HARYANA

The seats shall be reserved for the categories as under :

- (i) Scheduled Castes : 20%
- (ii) Backward Classes of Haryana (except Socially advanced persons/Sections (creamy layer) : 27% (16 % for Block-A) (11 % for Block-B)
- (iii) Special Backward Classes (except Socially advanced persons/Sections (creamy layer) : 10%
- (iv) Economically Backward Persons in the General Castes Category : 10%
- (v) Differently Abled (1% Blind or low vision, 1% Hearing impairment, 1% Locomotor disability or cerebral palsy) : 03%

If the seats reserved for Differently Abled persons remain vacant due to non-availability of suitable Differently Abled candidates, it may be offered to Ex-servicemen and their wards (1%) and dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

- (vi) Further 3% horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from Backward Classes category for admissions to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided/institutes located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A

and Block B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block A of Backward Classes are given seats in the Academic Year 2013, the next Block i.e. B Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2014 and so on. The Director of the Institute shall maintain a roster register for horizontal reservation of Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighter & their dependents and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the year. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided to the concerned category.

(D) Guidelines for Reservation:

1. The Reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment by the State Govt. from time to time.
2. If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block 'A' remain vacant these will be filled up from BC Block 'B' and vice versa.
3. The seats remaining vacant under various reserved categories other than SC category will be converted into General Category only if up to the date of display of final list no eligible candidate belonging to the respective reserved categories is available for admission.
4. Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste will submit the certificate as per Annexure-II, Backward Class (Block 'A' & 'B') will submit the certificate on the prescribed Proforma as per Annexure-III, Special Backward Classes as per Annexure-IV and affidavit as per Annexure V, at the time of Counseling.
5. The BC candidates (Block A&B) and Special Backward Classes for benefit of reservation shall also have to furnish an affidavit **duly attested by Executive Magistrate** on the prescribed proforma to the effect that he/she is not covered under the criteria of creamy layer as per Annexure-V at the time of Counseling. The said affidavit shall be furnished jointly by both father and mother of the candidate.
6. The Economically Backward Persons in the General Castes Category for benefit of reservation shall have to furnish a certificate from the concerned competent authority.
7. Only the candidates having permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the course) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. Disability certificate must be issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District. However, the certificate shall be subject to verification by a Medical Board of the University constituted for the purpose and the decision of the Board shall be final. Differently abled candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure-VI at the time of Counseling.
8. Children and Grand-Children of Freedom Fighters of Haryana are required to submit a certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner of the concerned District as per Annexure-VII at the time of Counseling.
9. Wards of Ex-servicemen of Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure-VIII at the time of Counseling.

10. For horizontal reservation, candidates of General, SC and BC categories will also have to furnish ESM/DFF certificate.
11. Under differently abled category, at least one candidate will be admitted, even if the share is less than 0.5 seats.
12. All the eligible candidates, whether from Haryana or from reserved categories can also compete for seats allocated under All India Category.
13. All the eligible candidates of reserved categories shall be considered first for Haryana General category seats.
14. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a university in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit certificates of bonafide residents of Haryana.

III ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- (a) Admission to the 1st Semester of B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) 5-Year Integrated Degree Course for the academic session 2013-14 shall be made on the basis of marks obtained by the candidates in the Entrance Test which will be conducted by the Controller of Examinations of the University. The candidates should secure minimum **30 marks** in Entrance Test- 2013 in order to be eligible (**20 marks** in the Entrance Test 2013 for SC of Haryana). The Entrance Test shall be of 10+2 standard and of two hours duration to be held at Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra

Date & time of Entrance Test : July 2, 2013 at 11.00 a.m.

The Entrance Test shall have 100 multiple choice objective type questions in the following areas and each question shall carry one mark:

(i)	General English	:	25 Questions
(ii)	General Knowledge & Current Events	:	50 Questions
(iii)	Aptitude, Reasoning, Mental ability	:	25 Questions

(The Candidates should report at the Test Centre half an hour before the time scheduled for commencement of the Entrance Test).

THE CANDIDATES SHALL BE ALLOWED TO APPEAR IN THE ENTRANCE TEST PROVISIONALLY SUBJECT TO DETERMINATION OF ELIGIBILITY AT THE TIME OF COUNSELING. THE CANDIDATES SHALL HAVE NO RIGHT TO CLAIM ADMISSION TO B.A. LL.B (Hons.) COURSE MERELY BECAUSE OF THEIR APPEARING IN THE ENTRANCE TEST.

- (i) The result of Entrance Test shall also be sent to the candidates by post. However, the University shall not be responsible for postal delay or loss of result in transit. Candidates are, therefore, advised to ascertain their result on their own from the office of the Institute.
- (ii) There will be no re-evaluation/re-checking of answer sheet of the Entrance Test and no request in this regard shall be entertained.

- (iii) In case two or more candidates obtain same percentage of marks in the Entrance Test, marks obtained in the qualifying Examination shall be taken into consideration, and in case there is still a tie, the marks obtained in the next lower Examination, and in case, there is still a tie, the candidate senior in age shall be given priority.

- (iv) Thereafter, the candidates shall produce the roll number slips obtained from the Fee Section to the office Assistant in the office of the Institute and get Section allotment slip.
- (v) If any candidate does not get the section allotment slip from the office of the Institute, his or her admission shall be treated as cancelled even though he or she may have deposited his or her fee. His or her seat shall be treated as vacant and shall be allotted to the next candidate. Such candidate shall himself/herself be responsible for the loss of admission.

Benefits of fee for SC Candidates of Haryana

Under the post-matric Scholarship Scheme of Government of India, SC students as per letter No. FC SC/BC/2011/204/98 dated 17.01.2011 for the Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary to Govt. Haryana Welfare of SC & BC, Chandigarh. SC students whose parents/guardian income is upto Rs. 2.00 lac per annum are eligible for benefits under the scheme. The benefits include enrollment/registration, tuition, games, library, magazine, medical examination and such fees compulsory payable by the students to the Institution or University/Board. Refundable deposit like caution

money, security deposit will, however, be excluded. For students admitted under this scheme the application form has to be submitted by the students to the Director of the Institute Law.

Note: An income declaration will be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardians of SC candidates, stating definite income from all sources by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper. Employed parents/guardians are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources, they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.

VI ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

Candidates who have passed qualifying Examination from another University/Board (other than the Board of School Education, Haryana) are required to obtain Eligibility Certificate from the Deputy/Asstt. Registrar (Regn.) after he or she has been admitted provisionally by the Institute. For this eligibility certificate, the prescribed Application Form can be obtained from the office of the Institute. Application form along with all original certificates/mark sheets etc. shall be submitted in the office of the Director so that the eligibility certificate can be obtained.

For Foreign Students

Candidates who have passed qualifying Examination from foreign University or Board are required to deposit Rs. 500/- as eligibility fee for obtaining Eligibility Certificate. The Eligibility Certificate will be issued by the Registration Branch on checking the required documents such as student's Visa and the original documents. No candidate can be given even provisional admission without obtaining Eligibility Certificate.

VII CHARACTER CERTIFICATE

Character Certificate is an essential document and is required to be submitted at the time of counseling. The private and regular candidates are required to obtain and submit the character certificate as follows:

(a) Private Candidates:

Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidates should submit their character certificate duly signed by First Class Magistrate with office stamp.

(b) Candidates who have recently passed the Qualifying Examination:

Candidates who have recently passed the qualifying examination must submit the Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended as per specimen attached (**Annexure I**).

(C) Gaps in Study : Male candidates who have gaps in their academic career after the qualifying exam., must furnish a gap certificate, in the form of affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper or certificate from the employer (if in service) and should also furnish separately the character certificate of gap period duly attested by Notary Public.

IX LAST DATE FOR RECEIPT OF APPLICATIONS

- (1) **Applications on the prescribed form and complete in all respects should reach in the office of the Director, Institute of Law K.U. Kurukshetra on or before June 18, 2013, upto 5.00 p.m. Incomplete applications or those received late shall not be considered under any circumstances.**
- (2) If the last date for receipt of admission forms falls on a holiday or that day is declared holiday by the University, the next working day shall be considered as the last date for the purpose.
- (3) Applications received in time in the office of the Director of the Institute shall be registered and a registration card shall be provided indicating the number under which candidate's name has been entered in the register and that number shall be quoted by the candidate in subsequent correspondence concerning his/her admission.

X GENERAL RULES OF THE COURSE

1. The duration of the course leading to the degree of B.A. LL.B. (Hons) shall be five academic years. Each academic year shall consist of two Semesters, i.e., July to December and January to May.
2. A student is required to attend not less than 75% of the lectures delivered in each of the subjects and also in Tutorials and Practical Classes, Extension Lectures, Moots, Seminars, Court Visits etc.
3. The medium of instruction as well as of examination shall be English only.
4. In each semester, there shall be 6 papers. In addition there shall be Seminars, Moot Courts, Project Reports, Tests, Assignments and Sessional work. Each paper shall be based on the syllabi and Scheme of Examination as prescribed by the Academic Council from time to time.
5. After successful completion of 5 Year Integrated Course, the candidates shall be awarded degree of B.A.LL.B (Hons).

XI If any student gets accommodation allotted in his/her name and allows some other person(s) to stay in his/her allotted room and/or to take meals, in that case the admission of both of the students, i.e. i) the allottee and ii) the illegal occupant, shall be cancelled from the Institute as well as from the hostel without assigning any reason.

XII HOSTEL FACILITIES

The University has 23 Hostels (10 for boys, 1 for Foreign male students and 12 for Girls students). The accommodation in the Hostels would be provided strictly on the basis of departmental merit list of admissions; and in accordance with limited number of seats in hostels allocated by the Chief Wardens to each Department with reservations (20% for SC category, 3% for Handicapped- blind/disabled with 70% and 1 seat for BPL category). The forms for Hostel accommodation are required to be submitted to the concerned hostel duly recommended by the concerned Chairperson/Director/Principal. Proof of Residence viz. Ration Card/Voter Card/

Passport shall have to be shown in original and an attested photocopy of the same needs to be enclosed with the Hostel Admission Form at the time of submission. Subletting is strictly prohibited. The sub letters and sublettees-both are liable to be expelled from the Hostel. Students willing to seek Hostel accommodation are advised to refer to the Hostel Rules Booklet available with the Manager Printing & Publications of University on payment of prescribed price. Any hosteller desirous of possessing vehicle in the Hostel shall have to submit an attested photocopy of R/C of the vehicle along with Driving License in the office of the Warden of the respective Hostel. If the Hostel authorities are not satisfied with the character, past behavior and antecedents of a student, they may refuse accommodation to him/her in order to ensure discipline and peaceful atmosphere of the Hostels.

XIII RULES FOR ADJUSTMENT/REFUND OF FEE

Rules for Adjustment/Refund of Fee may be observed w.e.f. the session 2013-14:-

1. If a candidate after having deposited fee for admission in one course joins another course in another University Teaching Dept./Institute in the same session, as mentioned below, and is permitted to withdraw his/her candidature, fee/funds except admission fee already deposited by him/her for the course from which he/she has withdrawn, shall be adjusted/refunded against the fee/funds of the course he/she joins subject to the condition that the difference, if any, shall be paid by the candidate :
 - (i) from a general course to another general course;
 - (ii) from a general course to a self-financing course or vice-versa.
 - (iii) from a self-financing course to another self-financing course.However, in self-financing courses, adjustment/refund of fee will be allowed only if the seat so vacated is filled by the last date of admission.
2. In case a candidate leaves the University after seeking admission in a particular course, following conditions will apply for refund of fee:
 - a) If a candidate leaves before the commencement of the classes, the entire fee deposited by the candidate will be refunded after deducting Rs.1000/- only.
 - a) In case a candidate leaves after commencement of the classes, proportionate deduction of fee upto the month of his/her leaving will be made, subject to minimum of Rs.1000/-. However, refund will be allowed only if the seat so vacated is filled by the last date of admission.

XIV CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING

Ragging is totally prohibited in the University and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with the UGC Regulations on

Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 as well as under the penal law for the time being in force.

- (b) indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;

- (c) asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- (d) any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- (e) exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- (f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- (g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it : sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- (h) any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- (i) any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

All the senior students are advised to guide and treat junior students affectionately.

Junior students may contact their Chairpersons or other University functionaries like Proctor, Dean Students Welfare, Chief Warden, Wardens or Chief Security Officer for help and guidance.

Appendix-A

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3rd October, 1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 and No.62/62/ 2011-6GSI dated 17th January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

Subject: **Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding.**

1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/ medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-
 - (i) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
 - (ii) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents : -
 - (a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
 - (b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - (a) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
 - (iii) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
 - (iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
 - (v) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - (vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - (vii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/ guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are :

- (a) Citizen of India;
 - (b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/ dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
 - (viii) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognised by Govt. of Haryana.
2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/ Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
 3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
 4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
 5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/technical/ medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.
