

DESCRIPTION OF THE CREST

The Crest of the University contains the motto in Sanskrit Jnanam Vijnanasahitham (Yajnatva mokshyase ashubhath- bhagvad Gita IX.I) which when freely translated would mean that 'Knowledge' together with the 'Knowledge of the Supreme' releases one, from all evils.  - The admission tickets for University Examination can be downloaded from the University website for which a relevant press note may be referred to. Those who are unable to download the admission ticket from the University website may contact this Directorate along with ID card & obtain admission ticket well in time. Admissions ticket will be issued only on production of ID card.
- 2. Please report to the Examination Centre as indicated in your admission ticket at least half an hour before the commencement of Examination.
- 3. Please be polite with the staff and teachers of the College and fellow students.
- 4. Candidates are governed by rules framed by University relating to examination malpractices. Candidates are prohibited from bringing into the Examination room, Pagers, Mobile phones, Digital diary/Electronic Organizer, any book or portion of a book; manuscript or paper of any description, from communicating with or copying from each other and from communicating with any person outside the Examination Room. Any candidate found violating of these rules shall be sent out of the room forthwith. COURSES OFFERED BY THE DIRECTORATE OF CORRESPONDENCE COURSES & DISTANCE EDUCATION

The Directorate of Correspondence Courses & Distance Education of Bangalore University was established in the year 1976. The Directorate offers different Courses of study leading to Under Graduate degrees, Post Graduate degree, Professional Degree, P.G. Diploma, Diploma and Certificate Courses.

i) CORRESPONDENCE SCHEME (FX)

Correspondence Scheme requires students to possess prescribed minimum educational qualifications for admission to each course, mentioned below. The printed study materials to assist the students will be provided. The various courses offered are:- *B.A, B.Com, B.B.M, M.A (all Subjects except Sanskrit and French), M.Com, M.Sc (Mathematics), Diploma, P.G Diploma and Certificate Courses.*

ii) OPEN UNIVERSITY SCHEME (OU)

Candidates seeking Admission under Open University scheme need not possess prescribed minimum educational qualifications, but must have completed 18 years of age as on 1st November 2012. Printed study materials will be provided to students; in addition contact programme/classes are conducted after due Intimation via SMS/Media. The fees are slightly higher for the students enrolled under this Scheme. The Open University Scheme offers only B.A & B.Com courses.

iii) EXTERNAL SCHEME (EX)

The external scheme requires students to possess prescribed minimum educational qualifications for admission to each course as mentioned against them, but no Study materials will be provided under this scheme. The External Scheme offers only: *M.A in French* & M.A in Sanskrit

10.0 : GENERAL GUIDELINES TO STUDENTS

REGISTRATION

10.1: Courses open to all

The courses offered by this Directorate are open to all the citizens of India who are residing in India. Registration cannot be claimed as a matter of right and the Directorate reserves all rights of admission / acceptance. Registration will be made only for such courses as notified by Directorate.

- 10.2: Students already registered for other courses are not eligible Students pursuing any other course (s) of study in this University or elsewhere either regular, correspondence, external or Open University scheme, are not eligible for admission to any of the courses offered by the Directorate, since they are not permitted to pursue two courses simultaneously.
- 10.3: Students who have passed the supplementary examination of the course are Eligible Candidates who have passed the AISSCE Examination in COMPARTMENT examination, SUBSEQUENT TO THE annual examination of April/ May 2012 conducted by the CBSE, Universities and other competent boards are also eligible for admission to any 1st year UG degree course during 2012-13.
- 10.4: Filling the Applications forms Application forms duly filled in completely should be submitted online.
- 10.5: Fee once paid is not refundable The present admission pack is valid only for the year 2012-13. Fee once paid by students to a course IS NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES, or can be adjusted for any other course offered by the Directorate and no correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
- 10.6: Procedure for admission:

All the Candidates are required to appear in person, for registration along with the following documents/requirements: (a) For all Categories of students

i) Original Marks Cards of qualifying examination: for verification and

return.

- ii) Original Caste Certificate if applicable: for verification and Return.
- iii) Original Service Certificate if applicable [Refer 6.4 (b) (i)]
- iv) Proof of Age for seeking admission under Open University Scheme
- v) Original Transfer Certificate-if available
- vi) Original Migration Certificate if applicable.
- vii) No Objection Certificate issued from the previous Institution
- viii) One set of photocopies of all the marks cards & Caste Certificate for retention
 - ix) Original Official receipt issued by Finance officer, BUB for having received Demand draft purchased in any nationalized bank for the prescribed fee drawn in favour of 'The Finance Officer, Bangalore University, Bangalore', purchased only after publication of Admission Notification and payable at any Nationalized Bank (*This is applicable to only such students who seek admission in the Directorate*)

Note: Applications will be rejected if the fee receipt is not enclosed.

10.7: Method of Payment

The Directorate will not accept cash from any student for any purpose, excepting through receipts for Crossed A/c payee Demand Draft, obtained from any of the Nationalized banks drawn in favor of the Finance Officer, Bangalore University, Bangalore and payable at State Bank of My sore, Bangalore. Students are advised to write their name, address, course and Telephone No. on the reverse side of the Demand Draft, to prove their benefices, as its purchaser. They shall be deposited with Finance officer, BUB and official receipt obtained.

- 10.8: Proof of Age and Date of Birth for students seeking admission under Open University Scheme
 - (a) Any one of the following documents are accepted as proof of age.
 - i) Original SSLC/ SSC marks card or Cumulative records/ Transfer Certificate containing date of birth.
 - ii) An extract from the admission register maintained in a school last attended and duly certified by the Head of the Institution concerned.
 - iii) Extracts from the records maintained by the Government or Semi Government institutions or from the Civic or Local Bodies.
 - iv) Passport.

Note: Affidavits, Horoscopes and any other unofficial documents are not accepted as proof of age.

10.9: Transfer Certificate / Migration Certificate

A Student who joins a course in the Directorate has to submit his/her Original Transfer Certificate from institution studied earlier.

Further, students, who have passed qualifying examination from the Universities outside the State of Karnataka, shall also submit Migration certificate along with Transfer Certificate within one month from the date of admission/ registration.

Those who do not submit their Transfer Certificates at the time of admission shall submit (duly filled) Form 'C' (Supplied along with the application), which will be returned to them along with I.D. Card. Students must interact with their previous institution to obtain and furnish their Transfer Certificate within one month from date of their admission. Candidates who fail to submit Transfer Certificate within a month will not be allowed to attend the examinations.

The Transfer Certificate, thus submitted will not be returned to the students even after the completion of the course or on discontinuation. Fresh TC will be issued only if they join any other Institution/ University on request by that Institution/ University and will be sent directly to the said Institution.

- 10.10: For Students of Universities/Boards other than Bangalore University/ Karnataka Boards:
 - i) Students who have passed the qualifying examination from any other University should produce Provisional/Degree Certificate and also submit a photocopy along with other documents at the time of registration.
 - Students who have passed the qualifying examination from other Universities outside the State of Karnataka are required to pay the eligibility fee of Rs.1597/- in addition to other fee.
- 10.11: Change / Transfer From Colleges / P. G. Departments and other Universities (Applicable only to the students registered WITH THE DIRECTORATE)

(i) with prior permission of the University, Students who have discontinued their studies after passing the I/II year examination of B.A/B.Com/M.A./M.Sc.(Maths)/M.Com DegreeProgrammes (Annual Scheme) in affiliated Colleges or in Departments of Bangalore University, are eligible for admission to the second year PG/second/third year UG of the respective courses under Correspondence scheme provided he / she is <u>eligible</u> to complete the course, as per the regulations of the University i.e., within the Maximum Duration Prescribed for each Course. Such Candidates should enclose with the application form:

a)No objection Certificate from the Institution Previously studied. b)All the Marks Cards of the Course.

c) Transfer Certificate in Original.

- d) Prescribed fee.
- (ii) Candidates who studied under semester scheme in colleges are permitted to register for subsequent years (annual scheme) under the Directorate for Correspondence Courses only if he / she has passed all the subjects of the previous semesters. They are also required to study and pass additional subjects of annual scheme if required, under rules.
- (iii) No candidate who has registered himself / herself for any course, under any scheme in the Directorate shall be permitted to enroll as regular student in a Department or a college (Both Day & Evening) in the middle of the course
- (iv) Candidate who is admitted to a course, on transfer from any other Universities, shall have to study and pass equivalent subjects which are prescribed by this University. Such candidate shall however, be eligible for declaration of class only.

10.12: Admission Provisional initially start with

The admission made is provisional and they will be confirmed only on fulfillment of all necessary requirements including documents.

10.13: Fake or Tampered Certificate/documents Students who submit fake or tampered Marks Cards/Certificates/Documents or Demand Drafts will invite disciplinary action as per the University procedures. Any student who is found to have concealed information about his/ her employment or violated any other provisions, is also liable to be removed from admission rolls forthwith, and will be deprived of the benefits of admission, examination, results, award of degree etc., apart from initiating appropriate disciplinary action and imposition of stringent penalties.

10.14: Yearly Registration Requirement

Students should register during every succeeding academic year. Students can register for II & III year classes/ courses irrespective of their performance at the previous year examination.

INSTRUCTIONS

10.15: Communication with students

Students who have enrolled in this Directorate should keep a watch for the important communications like contact programmes, date for payment of Examination fee, exam schedule, admission ticket, results etc., which would be notified in newspaper and/or sent to them through post, SMS, Website. Students have to write their correct permanent postal address with pin code and Telephone number and Mobile number legibly for communication to assist postal authorities/courier companies to deliver mail promptly. They are advised to furnish change in their mailing address if any to Directorate immediately. Directorate is not responsible for non-delivery of communications on account of any reason, beyond its control. The candidates are informed to collect information on website, SMS will also be sent to them.

10.16: Identity Card

For a fruitful interaction with the student, an identity card is issued every year and which is valid for that year only. Every student is advised to, invariably carry it during their visits to the Directorate for any purpose. In case of loss of I.D. Card, a Duplicate I.D. Card will be issued, on production of University receipt for a sum of Rs.100/- after due verification.

10.17: Study Material

The issue of study materials is under active re-consideration of the Academic Council. Decision is awaited.

The Study Materials provided by the Directorate do not provide in depth knowledge, of the subject, but helps them to equip themselves to face the examinations better. Hence Students are advised to refer to text books. Study material once given, will not be exchanged under any circumstances. Hence, students are advised to decide the medium i.e. English or Kannada at the time of admission itself.

10.18: Library Facility

Students registered in this Directorate and who desire to avail themselves of library facilities will be permitted to make use of the University Library. They are required to contact the University Librarian for further details.

10.19: Contact Classes

Contact classes/ Programme will be conducted for BBM, B.A. & B.Com (Open University scheme) and Postgraduate degree/ Postgraduate Diploma/ under correspondence scheme.

- 10.20: Accommodation
 - All candidates attending contact programme/assignments/Practical exam/have to make their own arrangements for their stay. No hostel/ Bus pass facility would be provided by the Directorate to the candidates.

SC/ST STUDENTS - FEE REIMBURSEMENT

10.21: Eligible (Unemployed) SC/ST candidates who claim reimbursement of fee from Social Welfare Department, Government of Karnataka, are required to submit the following documents along with the application obtained from the Directorate within 30 days from the date of registration to the Course:

EXAMINATIONS

10.22: Authority to Conduct Exams

The Examination for the Course offered by the Directorate will be conducted by the Registrar (Evaluation), Bangalore University. The Centers for examination will be notified before commencement of the examination. All the students of the Directorate are bound by the Rules, Regulations, Ordinances and Statutes of Bangalore University, Bangalore, framed from time to time.

10.23: Number of Examinations in a Year

In case of Undergraduate courses, (i) Main / Annual examination during May/June and (ii) Supplementary examination during November/December will be conducted. However, for P.G. Courses and other courses, only one examination during May/June will be conducted. Candidates are required to contact the directorate before the commencement of the examinations.

10.24: Dispatch of Admission Tickets

The admission tickets for University Examination can be downloaded from the University website, details of which will be notified through SMS & local dailies. Those who are unable to download the admission ticket from the University website, may contact this Directorate along with ID card with a recent passport size photograph & obtain admission tickets well in time. Admission ticket will be issued only on production of ID card.

10.25: Admission to Center of examination:

Students are compulsorily required to produce their (i) Identity card and (ii) admission ticket for admission to center of examination. Failure to do so will invite eviction from the said examination center by chief Superintendents.

10.26: Choice of Language of answer in an examination.

If available, students may choose to answer questions in an examination completely in the said chosen language. Switching over from one language to another language in a paper is not permissible. 10.27: Change of one of the Optional subject:

A Candidate who has offered certain combination of subjects at the beginning of the I year may seek change in only one of the three Optional subjects, at the beginning of the II year, but is required to appear and pass the examination in the (changed) subject of I year also, compulsorily.

- 10.28: Exemption from studying the subjects: A graduate who has passed any language under Part-I or optional subjects (B.A) under Part-II earlier, may claim exemption from their study of that language or those optional papers if he/she has studied and passed the same at the corresponding level, subject to conditions stipulated by the University.
- 10.29: Exemptions available to differently enabled students:-Students who are deaf or dumb or having learning disability are exempted from studying an Indian language prescribed under part-I.(Notification No-ACA/SUPTD/Language exemption 2004-05 dated-28.05.2004)
- 10.30: Internal Assessment and Viva-Voce. Internal assessment and Viva-Voce is a compulsory requirement which is prescribed for students admitted to BBM, M.Sc (Maths), M.Com and MBA courses. Failure to undergo will result in nonfulfillment of the course requirements, and also cancellation of registration. Internal Assessment and Viva-Voce dates will be intimated about the contact classes through SMS to the concerned candidates and on University website.
- 10.31: Declaration of results of examinations. The performance of students in examinations, are declared as per relevant regulations and indicated in statement of marks issued to them.

10.32: Important

1. Rejection of Results

Only Under Graduate Students are permitted to reject the results of the whole examination of May/June 2013, within 30 days after the publication of results. This rejection shall be exercised only once and shall not be revoked. The

application for rejection of results shall be submitted to the Registrar (Evaluation) along with the prescribed fee.

2. Revaluation/Challenge Valuation

Candidates who wish to apply for revaluation/Challenge Valuation have to first apply for photocopy of the answer script before Applying for revaluation/ Challenge Valuation. After taking the photocopy, if they feel that the marks awarded is not satisfactory, they may then apply for revaluation/ Challenge Valuation within the stipulated time. The photocopy of the answer scripts should be enclosed to the revaluation/ Challenge Valuation application form, as otherwise their revaluation/ Challenge Valuation application will be rejected. Candidates desirous of applying for revaluation/ Challenge Valuation shall have to pay the fee prescribed by the University from time to time for application, photocopy, Revaluation /Challenge Valuation fee.

- *Note*: SC/ST, CAT-I students are eligible for 50% of concession on prescribed fee.
- 3. Challenge Valuation (for P.G. courses only) :
 - Eligibility: No student shall be eligible to apply for challenge valuation unless he/she
 - 1. Has passed in not less than 50% of the theory papers of the examination in which he/she appeared (in case candidate who has taken 5 theory papers they shall pass in at least 2 theory papers).
 - Must have secured not less than 20% of the maximum marks in each of theory papers in respect of which he / she seeks to Challenge the valuation.

Note: (a) To apply within 10 days from the date of announcement of result/issue of marks card.

- (b) SC/ST/CAT-I students are eligible for 50% concession in the prescribed fee
- 4. Reappearance for the degree

A Candidate who has passed the degree examination with some optional subjects under Part-II may be permitted to appear subsequently for the same degree but with different optional group under the conditions prescribed by the University. 10.33: Procedure for Issue of Provisional Degree Certificate

Students who qualify for the degree and who seek Provisional Degree Certificate; may apply in the prescribed application, enclosing photocopies of all the marks cards. (Original Marks cards should also be produced for verification and return) & University receipt for having paid Rs. 400/-, only after 30 days from the date of announcement of result.

a) Undergraduate students who have not successfully completed 3rd year degree in one attempt should obtain consolidated marks card and then apply.

b)Postgraduate students who have not successfully completed 1st & 2nd year degree in one attempt should obtain consolidated marks cards of both the years and then apply.

10.34: Procedure to apply for Degree Certificate

Students, who qualify for the award of degree, may apply for Degree Certificate in the Convocation, in the prescribed format after issue of Notification by the Registrar (Evaluation) in the leading news papers during October/November and February.

Note: All the students are advised to keep the prospectus till they complete their programme, since it provides useful information to them. Unnecessary Correspondence about the details already available in this prospectus may be avoided. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor, Bangalore University, Bangalore is final on the issue and problems that arise on any matter pertaining to the courses offered by the Directorate.

On Government holidays and third Saturday of every month the Directorate of Correspondence Courses & Distance Education is closed. No transaction will take place on those days.
