What is MBA?

An MBA provides the modern manager with tools and skills needed to identify new opportunities for organizational success. MBA programs are designed to make one aware of different approaches that have traditionally helped in managing large organizations. An MBA is typically a 2 year program.

First Year

Introduction to all functional areas of management. Get exposed to all facts of running a business organization.

Summer Project

Second Year

Includes 6 - 8 compulsory courses and about 17 - 20 electives of your choice

Areas of specialization

Depending on your competency, you can specialize in any one of the fields: Marketing, Finance, Human Resources, Systems, Operations, Strategy, International Business, etc.

Placements

Companies hold a recruitment drive on campus. They conduct interviews and select students who join their companies after their MBA graduation

Industry

At the end of your program, you join an organization as a Management Trainee. The training period may vary from 6 months to a year, at the end of which you will be absorbed in a managerial role.

Specializations

It is vital to select the right field of management to specialize in, as normally this would be the discipline in which you would get your first job and possibly even make a career. Although the number of specializations offered by universities is increasing day by day, they can be classified broadly into the following categories:

Marketing: Marketing plays a key role in the industries such as fast moving consumer goods (FMCG), advertising and market research, sales & distribution, and product or brand management. A large number of CEOs often belong to this discipline.

Operations Management: Operations play a key role in the fields of quality control, material management, productivity improvement, inventory control, production planning, supply chain management and logistics.

Finance: Finance plays a key role in the fields of consumer and investment banking, institutional finance, merchant banking, corporate finance and international finance. With a specialization in Finance you can look for exciting careers in banks, financial consultancies, or financial institutions.

Systems Management: Systems plays an important role in the fields of systems consultancy, account management/project management, systems department of organizations, business development and sales & marketing. Systems Management is normally an integration role between client (internal/external) and programmers

Human Resource Management: It plays a key role in the fields of human resource development, personnel management and industrial relations.

MBA Entrance Exams

Common Admission Test (CAT)

Common Admission Test (CAT) is conducted by the IIMs for entrance to their Post Graduate Programs in Management. There are over 80 B-Schools other than the IIMs that use the CAT scores for admissions to their courses. For institutes other than the IIMs, using the CAT scores, the student has to apply for the B-School specific prospectus separately in addition to the CAT bulletin.

Xavier Admission Test (XAT)

Xavier Labour Relations Institute (XLRI), Jamshedpur conducts the XAT. There are over 40 B-Schools other than XLRI that use the XAT scores for admissions to their courses.

Joint Management Entrance Test (JMET)

JMET is the entrance test for admission into Management Schools set up by the Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) and Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore (IISC).

Symbiosis National Aptitude Test (SNAP)

SNAP is the Single Entrance Test compulsory for candidates seeking admission to any Post Graduate institute under the Symbiosis International University. This includes II Management Institutes.

Management Aptitude Test (MAT)

MAT is usually conducted 4 times in a year. Over 300 schools across India accept MAT scores.

AIMA Test for Management Admissions (ATMA)

The All India Management Association conducts the ATMA. A number of B-schools use the ATMA score for shortlisting candidates.

State Common Entrance Tests (CETs)

Most Indian States conduct Common Entrance Tests for admissions to B-Schools affiliated to the State University. The most popular State CET is the MAH-CET of Maharashtra. Other popular CETs are PGCET or Karnataka, GCET of Gujarat, ICET of Andhra Pradesh and TANCET of Tamilnadu.

Selection Procedure

Written Test

The first phase of selection of candidates is on the basis of their performance in a Written Test. This seeks to test the aptitude of the candidate in areas like Verbal Ability, Reading Comprehension, Quantitative Ability, Data Interpretation and Reasoning.

Verbal Ability: Comprehension test is aimed at gauging the understanding of English language of the candidates.

Quantitative Aptitude: A candidate seeking admission to MBA programme is expected to have aptitude for basic and elementary Mathematics as well as the knack of solving algebra and geometry problems

Logical Reasoning: This tests the candidate's reasoning power in areas like Analytical Reasoning, Logical or Critical Reasoning and Mathematical Reasoning.

Data Interpretation: In this section, Data Interpretation has to be done through graphs, pictures or tables that might require extensive calculations.

General Knowledge: Some written exams also include a section on general knowledge.

Group Discussion and Interview

The candidates short-listed after the written test are further tested for their suitability to the Management profession through personality tests such as the Group Discussion & Personal Interview. These tests are held under the supervision of experts.

Group Discussion: This tests the interpersonal communication skills of the candidate, in a group, on a given topic. The objective is to check the candidate's leadership qualities, team work and creativity.

Personal Interview: This is to assess the candidate's career objectives, thought process, awareness, grasp, ability to handle stress and levels of motivation. The Interview also looks for variety of interests and accomplishments of the candidate in extra-curricular activities.

IIM, Bangalore includes a test on Essay writing.

SPjain, Mumbai, conducts a Group Interview.

XLRI, Jamshedpur, conducts only an interview, no GD.

FMS, Delhi, includes an Extempore Speech as part of their selection process. The final selection is based on the total marks obtained by the candidate in all the areas of aptitude. Work experience is given additional weightage at most of the institutes.
