II. ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

1. BENEFITS:

The OAS-ISS scholarships will cover 60% of tuition fees.

The scholarship recipient will be responsible for all remaining costs including:

- Remaining tuition fees;
- Registration fee;
- Immigration fees (including schengen visa);
- Study visit;
- Study materials;
- Health insurance premium including administration costs;
- Living expenses;
- Round trip airfare;

2. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

All Applicants must:

- Be citizens or permanent residents of an OAS member country.
- Hold at least a Bachelor's degree or its equivalent.
- Possess basic computer and internet skills

- Have work experience in related field
- Have good command of English, with documentary evidence, if not the native language. Applicants
 for whom English is not the first or native language should submit one of the following to verify
 English proficiency:
 - An official transcript verifying completion of studies in an English speaking university in the last five years
 - A test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) with a score of 580 or higher for the paper based test, 237 for computer-based test or 92 for internet-based test; IELTS 6.5, or the equivalent

3. SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION RESTRICTIONS:

Please note that you are not eligible to apply for this scholarship if you currently hold an OAS Scholarship for Academic Studies;

Also, Staff members of the General Secretariat, persons under performance contracts with the General Secretariat, staff members of the permanent missions to the OAS, and their relatives are not eligible for OAS academic scholarships.

4. SUBMISSION OF SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION:

Required documents:

- Letter of admission to the Program mentioned
- Completed Scholarship <u>Application Form</u>
- Copy of the transcript of the latest degree obtained
- Updated resume
- One letter of recommendation of current or most recent employer

Applicants should complete and submit the Scholarship Application Form and the required documents (above) in English and PDF format, as one file, no later than July 1st, 2012, via e-mail to nduncan@oas.org with copy to Jpoteausaintime@oas.org with the subject matter: "OAS-ISS Scholarships".

5. SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION CRITERIA:

Scholarships shall be granted based on the following criteria:

- The merits and overall credentials of the candidate, including his/her academic and professional background, and
- An extensive and equitable geographic distribution for the benefit of all member states that takes into account the greater needs of the smaller and relatively less developed economies.

6. RESPONSIBILITIES OF SCHOLARSHIPS RECIPIENTS:

All Scholarship Recipients must:

- Show proof of additional funding
- Fulfill all requirements of the program for which the OAS-ISS scholarship is awarded
- Confirm their acceptance of the scholarship award by signing and returning to OAS DHDEC their completed form: "Acceptance of the Scholarship Award".
- Inform the OAS Department of Human Development, Education and Culture before July 25th, 2012 in the event he/she is unable to begin the program of study so that the scholarship may be offered to the next ranked candidate.
- Reimburse GS/OAS and ISS the total amount of the scholarship costs if he/she declines the scholarship after the start of the program without compelling proof/reason.
