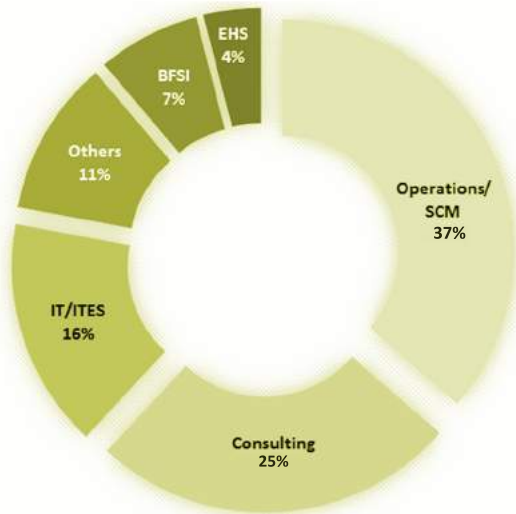

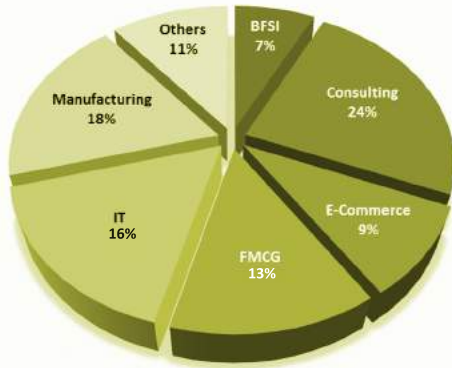
Functional Break-up

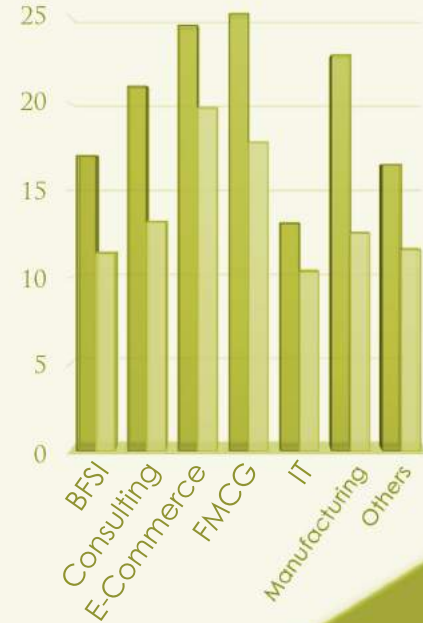
