

# GENERAL RULES

- 1. Students are grouped into 5 categories for competition:
  - I. Kiddies (Classes I & II)
  - II. Sub-juniors (Classes III & 1V)
  - III. Juniors (Classes V, VI &VII)
  - IV. Seniors (Classes VIII, IX& X)
  - V. Super Seniors (Classes XI & XII)
  - Common means a school sponsors a single (Common group for an item from any category.)
- 2. There will be no competition for the KG Section.
- 3. There will be no separate competition for boys and girls.
- Only one participant /team will be allowed to participate in one item from a school.
- Competitions will take place on different stages simultaneously.
- For all items, participants should report half an hour prior to the scheduled time at the respective stages to pick the lot, failing which a team/ participant stands disqualified.
- 7. Participants should not be in school uniform.
- 8. Participants are expected to perform according to their lot number. Allowances may be made in case of a clash. But participants are expected to perform before the completion of that item, failing which he/she stands disqualified.
- 9. An item (group/single) shall not be conducted as a competitive event if the number of participating teams/ individuals is less than four.
- 10. There will be no first, second and third prizes for the Kalotsav, instead grades will be given for the events and the Points for the Grades will be given to the respective schools. Trophies will be awarded to the winners of each category. For details, refer to the brochure.
- 11. Results shall be announced by one of the judges immediately after each competition in the respective venues.
- 12. Decision of the panel of judges will be final and binding.

- 13. Complaints to the jury of appeal, if any, shall be given in writing, with the signature of the teacher-in-charge of the concerned school, with a fee of Rs.500 to the Secretary of the Association within 15 minutes of the announcement of the result.
- 14. Transport and the handling of OWN musical instruments shall remain the responsibility of each individual competitor/school.
- 15. Participants are strictly forbidden from entering any room other than the one allotted to them.
- 16. a) A student can participate only in one individual item and one group item.
  - b) Requests for clash of timings will not be entertained for those students participating in the 1 hr - 3 hr items.
- 17. Pre- recorded CDs can be used for dance items. One CD should contain only one track. CDs are not allowed for Margamkali.
- 18. For Light Music and Folk Dance (single) competitions, only Malayalam songs are permitted.
- 19. The completed task material of creative items will not be returned to the participants after the conduct of the event.

# SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Duly filled in entry forms for the respective groups and common items should be sent to the school office on or before 20th October 2011 by email or post.
- 2. Once the entry form is sent, no alteration will be entertained.
- 3. All schools are requested to pay a registration fee of Rs.5000.
- Participants are requested to pin on to their clothing participant numbers while they are on the Kalotsav campus.
- Identify the time and stage of your events. 5.
- Report to the stage manager of the respective stages 30 minutes before the commencement of the events.
- 7. In case of a clash, collect the clash form the office and get it sanctioned for the programme in which one is participating. Then report at both the stages before the commencement of the event and follow the direction of the stage managers.
- 8. Participants who fail to report even after the third call will stand disqualified.
- Hand over the participant number card to the stage manager and 9. get your code number card. Pin card on to clothing whenever you perform.
- 10. The participants are strictly instructed to finish their items within the stipulated time. The warning bell will be given one minute before the stipulated time. The participant will be allowed to continue his/her performance even after the final bell, but judgment will be done only for the allotted time.
- 11. After the completion of your item give back your code numbers to the stage manager and collect the participant number, duly signed by the stage manager.
- 12. The representative from the participating school is expected to complete the registration formalities at the Kalotsav office at Devagiri CMI Public School before 8.00 a.m. on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2011. Please make sure that you have received the kit (consisting of participation number cards, escorting teachers' badges, green room number, programme schedule, food coupons etc.) for your school.
- N.B. The schools who won the Ever Rolling Trophies of Kalotsav 2010 should hand over the same at the school office on or before 1st November 2011

    - (b) Seguins and gum should be brought by the participant.

- vi) Hesitation a pause of more than two seconds.
- (c) A successful challenge allows the challenger to take over the talk from the speaker for the remaining time.
- (d) Speakers are scored by the number of seconds that they can speak without being challenged successfully. Thus the maximum number of points is 60. The moderator will keep careful check of time. The person with the most number of points at the end of the allotted period wins.

RULES: (a) A written preliminary round will be conducted.
