Guidelines for Writing Assignments

- 2) **Organising:** Be a little selective and analytical before drawing up a rough outline of your answer. Give adequate attention to question's introduction and conclusion.

Make sure that:

- a) The answer is logical and coherent.
- b) It has clear connections between sentences and paragraphs.
- c) The presentation is correct in your own expression and style.
- 3) Presentation: Once you are satisfied with your answer, you can write down the final version for submission. It is mandatory to write all assignments neatly in your own handwriting and Write your Name, Course Code, Enrollment No. and Batch of admission on all the assignments in bold letters.

If you so desire, you may underline the points you wish to emphasize. Make sure that the answer is within the stipulated word limit.
