Mission



Student Support Services

The College provides a number of infrastructure and other facilities to the students from the very date of admission viz:

Library Facilities:

• Central Library

The College has a large Central Library, rich in the collection of over 30000 text and rare books covering all subjects, journals, and periodicals with an *open access system*. Reading as well as borrowing facilities is provided. Library cataloguing is totally computerised.

• Reading Room

Each Honours and Postgraduate Department possesses a seminar library to provide students with text and reference books and journals. The Postgraduate library of the Department of Geography is linked with the Central Library through LAN.

Students' Counselling Desk:

Student-friendly teachers are always available to sort out specific academic problems as well as for personal and social problems.

☐ Placement Cell:

The Placement Cell (UGC-aided) of this College has started functioning with an aim to show the students the right path to professional world. Different training courses necessary for the purpose are also conducted at nominal charges. Campus interviews with a considerable success rate are also conducted by the Cell.

☐ Grievance Redressal Cell:

It comprises a complaint box in the entrance to redress the grievance of the students with Principal in its apex.

☐ Students' Financial Aid and Stipends:

Students aid fund

It *extends* financial help to the poor but meritorious, regular students from Students' Aid Fund and Seminar Society of the College.

• SC/ST Stipend

Stipend for the physically challenged and SC/ ST students are awarded by the Government and different organizations.

Concession

Travelling concession for students is available as per Indian Railway and rules of State Transport Corporation.

• Concession for BPL card holders

BPL card holders get special concession from the institution.

• Teachers' financial assistance

Teachers of the College have generated a fund for poorer section of the students.

Services towards Health and Medical Facilities:

• Purified drinking water

Cooled and purified drinking water supply is from aqua guard.

Medical Facilities

A separate medical room is there with provision of first-aid and availability of doctors. Medical facilities like regular health check up, blood group detection are available from Students' Health Home and other voluntary organizations. Basic medicines are also provided free of cost.

• Medical Benefit Fund

The College has generated a fund for the students from financially backward section to help them for their medical treatment.

• Students' Health Home

Students can avail of the health and medical facilities given by Students' Health Home on payment of an annual fee of Rs. 5.

☐ College Cheap Store

It is a corner where stationeries including pen, writing sheets and copies are available.

Co and Extra-curricular Activities:

Inter and intra-college competitions in debate, drama, elocution, music, drawing, short story, theme collage etc. are arranged frequently. Vivekananda Day, College Social, Freshers' Welcome are held regularly.

Annual Sports is a regular event. Students also take part in various inter-college competitions and coaching camps. College has its own cricket practicing pitch and regular training is provided in table tennis, by accredited coaches.

The college has a strong NCC unit and training is provided under the supervision of bonafide NCC officer on every Wednesday and Saturday.

□ National Service Scheme (NSS):

NSS unit of the College is taking part regularly in different extended services under financial assistance of Calcutta University.

Media Room:

Academic Profile & Admission Procedure

- A Three-Year (1+1+1) Bachelor Degree Honours(B.A./B.Sc.) and General Course (B.A./B.Sc/B.Com.) is offered to students who have passed the Higher Secondary or its equivalent examinations recognized by University of Calcutta and other criteria as stated by the College.
- Prior to selection each candidate may have to fill in the selection form available from the Office.
- Admission forms will be issued to the selected candidates on production of original mark-sheets and admit cards from the college office.
- Selections are made strictly on merit basis/ entrance test (in some specific subjects)
- All other specifications regarding admission procedure will be notified on College Notice board after the publication of results of Higher Secondary Examination of West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education.

- Each student has to appear and qualify in three University Examinations (Part I, Part II & Part III) under B.A. or B.Sc. or B.Com course to obtain Bachelor Degree (Honours / General).offered by the University of Calcutta.
- Students are allowed to sit in the Part I / II /III examinations on the basis of regulations laid down by the University of Calcutta vide relevant notifications published by the University.
 - \Rightarrow 75% attendance is compulsory to be sent up for Part I /II /III examinations as collegiate student. A minimum of 60% attendance is required to be sent up as non-collegiate candidate with necessary fine.
 - ⇒ Performance in college examination is also an important criterion to allow the students for the University Examinations.
- Absence from the class may only be excused on *Medical Grounds*. Such students are to apply to the Principal along with proper medical certificate and prescription immediately.
- Absence from any College Examination may only be excused on *Medical Grounds* Such students are to apply to the Principal along with proper medical certificate and prescription within a week from the commencement of the examination.
- Continuous absence of 30 days or more from the class without any intimation will lead to struck off name from attendance register.
- An Educational Excursion is compulsory for students willing to take Geography, Anthropology, Botany or Zoology as Honours or General subject.

Section 3: Payment of Fees of UG Courses

- As soon as the applicant is offered admission to the college, the full fee becomes payable.
- All kind of fees are payable in the cash counter of the college.
- Fees must be paid within the 15th of the month for which the same is due.
- Fees up to the month of *June* must be cleared in the First, Second and Third Year Classes prior to their corresponding terminal examinations.
- Name of the student will be struck off the rolls in case of non-payment of tuition fees for three consecutive months.
- All admissions are valid for a year, and are therefore to be renewed for each subsequent year of study.
- Fees once paid can neither be refunded nor carried over for a further session.
- Laboratory deposit for laboratory based subjects and Library deposit are non-refundable.
- University fees are exempted for physically challenged students.
- An Educational Excursion is compulsory for students willing to take Geography, Anthropology, Botany or Zoology as Honours or General subject.

Admission Procedure

ELIGIBILITY TO APPLY

The following **girl** candidates are eligible to apply for admission in Post graduate Course in Geography in Vivekananda College for Women, Barisha, Kolkata-8, affiliated to University of Calcutta.

- Honours Graduates in Geography from University of Calcutta of the current year.
- Honours Graduates in Geography from University of Calcutta of the preceeding year.
- 1st Class Honours Graduates or, its equivalent of other Indian Universities of the (10+2+3) pattern.

\square ISSUE OF APPLICATION FORMS

- Applications should be made in SELECTION FORM obtainable along with PROSPECTUS from the office of Vivekananda College for Women, Barisha, Kolkata-700008.
- SELECTION FORM and PROSPECTUS for PG course may also be downloaded from the College
 website: www.vivekanandacollegeforwomen.com and duly filled downloaded Selection Form
 may be submitted to the office against the payment scheduled for the same.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

- 22% for SC and 6% for ST, *
- Physically Challenged: 3% of the total number of seats**
- Non-CU: Maximum 5% of the total number of seats subject to availability of suitable candidates.

*As per Government rule **Scheduled Caste** and **Scheduled Tribe** candidates in her domicile state are entitled to get the **reservation facility**. SC/ST certificate issued by the competent authority of Government of West Bengal are only accepted.

A Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe student getting admission should obtain marks in the previous qualifying examination in the relevant Honours subject not lower than 25% than that of obtained by the last candidate admitted from the General Category.

**Physically Challenged Candidates having disability 40% and above are entitled to get reservation facility.

Physically Challenged candidates must attach a certificate from the competent authority.

☐ SUBMISSION OF SELECTION FORMS

- Duly filled Selection Forms in all respects are to be submitted in the Office of Vivekananda College for Women, Barisha, Kolkata-700008 within the prescribed date.
- Incomplete Forms are liable to be rejected.

MODE OF SELECTION

- Admission is strictly in order of merit, judged on the basis of marks secured in Honours subject.
- In case of a tie, the aggregate marks in top four subjects obtained in H.S.(10+2) or equivalent examinations excluding environmental studies/science will be taken into consideration.
- Selection of C.U. Honours candidates of the preceeding year will be done according to merit; provided that their marks are not less than the lowest marks of current year's candidates

admitted. However, the number of such candidates admitted should not cross 5% of the total seats in the subject concerned.

- Non-C.U. candidates will be selected through interview to be held on scheduled date.
- Counselling will be held after publication of the merit list on scheduled date.
- At the time of Interview and at the time of Counselling / Admission all original documents must be produced.

All Non-C.U. students admitted in the P.G. Courses must have to submit application for Registration at Calcutta University in prescribed format along with Original Migration Certificate from previous University within a month of admission.

Section 4: Payment of Fees of PG Courses

- As soon as the applicant is offered admission to the college, the full fee becomes payable (as per fee structure enclosed).
- At the time of Admission Tuition Fee and Laboratory Fee for three months along with all semester and annual charges are to be deposited.
- All kind of fees (except fines) are payable in the cash counter of the college after verification.
- Fees must be paid within the 15th of the month for which the same is due.
- Fees up to the month of end semester must be cleared prior to their corresponding terminal examinations.
- Name of the student will be struck off the rolls in case of non-payment of tuition fees for two consecutive months.
- All admissions are valid for a semester, and are therefore to be renewed for each subsequent semester of study.
- Fees once paid can neither be refunded nor carried over for a further session.
- Educational Excursion is compulsory. A minimum amount of Rs. 8000/- will be required for the purpose.
