Established in 1924, the Faculty of Law is known as one of the best Law Schools not only in India but also in Asia. The Faculty has a glorious past of nine decades. The contributions made by the well known Professors to the Faculty over the years have taken the Faculty to new heights. The strong infrastructure, qualitative teaching, revised case materials, regular research, excellent library, moot court competitions, campus placements, regular conferences are some of the features which have established the Faculty as a Centre of Excellence. The Faculty has been rated as the best Law Faculty in the country having three year LL.B. course. The Faculty has more than 100 teachers and 7000 students at present. The Visiting Faculties from different parts of the world visit the Faculty from time to time to deliver lectures and interact with the teachers and the students.

The case materials of LL.B. and LL.M. are revised by the faculty members in every semester with full dedication. The new developments in the field of law are being incorporated in the syllabus on regular basis and taught in the classrooms. This makes the imparting of legal education more meaningful and useful. The faculty members are contributing their research papers on regular basis to *Delhi Law Review* and *National Capital Law Journal*, which are being published by the Faculty and Law Centre-II annually. The Faculty is at the forefront in declaring timely results of the students. All faculty members get themselves involved in the central evaluation work to bring out the results well in time. The Faculty is at the threshold of great expansion. It is going to add



more than 100 teachers in the near future. This will give further boost to the academic and research activities of the Faculty.

The organization of Moot Court competitions, debates, group discussions, client counseling competitions are regular features in the Campus Law Centre, Law Centre – I and Law Centre-II of the Faculty. Apart from this, the students from all the three Centres participate in the Moot Court competitions organized in all parts of the country. It is a matter of great pride that our students have brought laurels to the Faculty by winning many prizes in these competitions.

The Faculty of Law published a book on *Human Rights in 21st Century: Changing Dimensions* which consists of around 100 articles on various aspects of human rights. An International Conference on *Contribution of International Environmental Law for Sustainable Development: Global and National Perspectives* was organized by the Faculty on February 17-18, 2012. More than 400 participants from all parts of the country and abroad participated in the Conference. More than 150 participants made their presentations in the two-day Conference in three parallel sessions. The Campus Law Centre, Law Centre-I and Law Centre - II also organized many seminars, conferences and workshops apart from other academic events.

A large number of delegations from universities from different countries visited the Faculty. Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) with respect to exchange programme were also signed between the Faculty and the foreign universities. The foreign professors are also visiting the Faculty on various fellowship programmes and doing their research at the Faculty.

The Faculty of Law, a leader in the field of legal education, has a tradition of producing dynamic leaders, judges, bureaucrats, professors and advocates who have left marks in their fields. I wish candidates joining the Faculty will carry this tradition further and contribute to the development of this biggest democracy of the world.

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The Faculty of Law

The Faculty of Law was established in 1924 and the then Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi, Dr. Hari Singh Gaur, was its first Dean. The present Dean of the Faculty is twenty-fifth. The Faculty was initially housed in the Prince's Pavilion in the Old Vice Regal Lodge Grounds. It was only in 1963 that the Faculty moved to its present location at the Chhatra Marg, University of Delhi, Delhi. Initially, Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) Degree course was treated as a two-year part-time course and the teaching was conducted in the morning with ten teachers. The evening classes along with morning classes for LL.B. started in the year 1942. The teaching for one year Master of Laws (LL.M.) Degree started in the year 1944. LL.M. was made a whole-time two-year course in the year 1947. As a result of partition of the country in 1947, the demand for admission to the Faculty increased. It was also time to look beyond the entrenched British model and restructure legal education to meet the demands of a new Independent India clamouring for equality in access to power, respect and knowledge. Lawyers played a major role in the struggle for freedom. They now had to be trained to create and use law as an instrument of social change. Two new courses, viz. Degree of Bachelor of Civil Laws (B.C.L.) and Certificate of Proficiency (Law), were made a whole-time course though classes were held both in the morning as well as in the evening. With the enactment of the Advocates Act, 1961, the Certificate of Proficiency (Law) course was abolished. The B.C.L. Degree course was discontinued in the year 1966.

The year 1966 is memorable in the history of the Faculty of Law and legal education in the country: Dean P.K. Tripathi and his team of dedicated teachers adopted and implemented almost all the recommendations, in the 1964 Report, of the Gajendragadkar Committee on Legal Education (appointed by Vice-Chancellor Dr. C.D. Deshmukh). The two-year LL.B. course was made a three year (six semester) course with an internal examination at the end of each semester. There were major innovations in the method of teaching: the discussion method of teaching was to be followed and not simply the lecture method where students were merely passive recipients of information. Towards this end, the "case method" of teaching, with decided cases and other study materials being given to the students in advance, was introduced, which enabled the Faculty of Law to achieve the goal of making students active participants in the learning process, thereby also ensuring an in-depth study of law. Teacher participation in the management of the Faculty was ensured through appointment of various committees with elected members. All these developments were pioneering and unique in the teaching of law for any Indian law school at that time.

From 1970, both morning and evening classes were being held in the Faculty building at Chhatra Marg. But to meet the long standing demand for more seats, an evening Law Centre was established at Mandir Marg, New Delhi in the year 1970, which is presently located at the North Campus, Chhatra Marg, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007. The evening classes in the Faculty building were discontinued in a phased manner in the next two successive years. However, the demand for more seats led to the establishment of one more evening Law Centre in South Delhi known as Law Centre - II at A.R.S.D. College premises, Dhaura Kuan, New Delhi-110021 in the year 1971 where it is presently located. The Faculty has now three Law Centres: Campus Law Centre and Law Centre - I at the Faculty of Law (North Campus), Chhatra Marg, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007 and Law Centre - II at Dhaura Kuan, New Delhi-110021.



A uniform and common teaching and examination schedule was adopted for all the three Law Centres from July, 2007. The teaching period was made uniform with each lecture consisting of one hour. Under the direct control and supervision of the Dean, common Case Materials are being thoroughly revised each semester in each of the 40 courses taught in the Faculty. The same is also available free of cost at Delhi University website. One examination is held for all the students of LL.B. on the basis of Date-sheet notified at the beginning of the semester.

The Dean, Faculty of Law administers Master of Laws (LL.M.) (Two-year full-time course meant for those who are not employed or engaged in any trade, profession, business or occupation) and Three-year part-time course (meant for all), Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) and Doctor of Civil Laws (D.C.L.) programmes along with Master of Comparative Laws (M.C.L.) for foreign nationals. The admissions are made strictly on the basis of merit in the LL.M. Entrance Test held at the national level each year. Not more than 10 foreign nationals are admitted to the M.C.L. programme. The LL.M./M.C.L. students are supplied with detailed updated reading materials of high standards in all the courses.

The Faculty has been admitting and receiving students for LL.B., M.C.L. and Ph.D. programmes from many countries such as Bhutan, China, Ethiopia, Fiji, Germany, Indonesia, Iran, Japan, Jordan, Korea, Mongolia, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Ukraine, United States of America, France, Vietnam, etc. The applications from foreign nationals with degrees from foreign countries are accepted only through Foreign Students Advisor of the University of Delhi. The foreign nationals are exempt from appearing in LL.B./LL.M. Entrance Test. The admission of foreign nationals is made from amongst applications received upto 15 June of the year in which admission is sought.

The Faculty has a comprehensive research programme leading to the award of Ph.D. Degree. In all, more than 200 research scholars have been awarded Ph.D. Degree. One person has also been awarded D.C.L. Degree.

Faculty Publications

The Faculty has been publishing a journal titled *Delhi Law Review* since 1972. The Journal contains articles from eminent academicians from India and abroad. The Faculty is also publishing a separate issue of *Delhi Law Review* containing contributions from the students. Apart from this, the Law Centre-II is also publishing a journal titled *National Capital Law Journal*.

The Faculty published a book on *Human Rights in 21st Century: Changing Dimensions*. The book consists of around 100 articles on various aspects of human rights. It has been edited by Prof. Gurdip Singh and Dr. V.K. Ahuja. The case materials of all terms of LL.B. and LL.M. Courses are also being published by the Faculty on regular basis. The faculty members make thorough revision of the case materials with full dedication in each term.

Faculty Placement Council

The Faculty Placement Council got tremendous response from its inception from the big corporate houses and multinational companies, leading law firms, LPOs, KPOs, NGOs and international publishers.

With the unflinching efforts made by the Dean, Faculty of Law, Director, Placement Council and the core group of students, the Council got new dimensions. The Council is giving utmost importance to the personality development of the students right from the first year of LL.B. course to make them acquire quality legal skills and the ability to face challenges in the legal disciplines. This

is helping the students to exhibit their best in writing their competitive examinations, group discussion (GD) and personal interviews.

The Faculty is witnessing campus recruitments on regular basis. All the students of the Faculty are taking part in the placement activities enthusiastically as they know that they have not to struggle after completion of their studies to find a good career. In the past, the students got offers through the Placement Council in Reliance Industries Limited, Mawana Sugars, India Infrastructure Finance Co. Ltd., OSC Export Services Ltd. (KPO), Gurgaon, PANGEA 3 (LPO), Mumbai, H5 Asia Pacific (KPO) Mumbai, LexisNexis Butterworths, New Delhi, Manupatra Information Solutions Pvt. Ltd., NOIDA, Parivaritram (NGO), Human Rights Law Network (NGO), Delhi, Partners for Law in Development, etc. The Council has been successful in providing excellent jobs with lucrative packages to the students.

The students got the opportunity as interns at the National Human Rights Commission, National Commission for Women, Supreme Court and High Court of Delhi, Central Information Commission, Oil and Natural Gas Commission.

Faculty Library

The Faculty Library is one of the best and the biggest libraries in the country. It was established in July 1924. It has over one lakh books, thesis/dissertations and a large number of law reports and journals. It subscribes to nearly 160 national and international journals. The Faculty Library caters to the needs of students and researchers engaged in legal studies and intensive research, besides catering to the needs of the Bench and the Bar. The library has its own website. The Library uses TROODON : 4 software for the issue and return of the books with the bar code method.

The Library has a dedicated E-Resource Centre for accessing a large number of electronic databases of journals and reference sources subscribed by the University through the Library's website. These databases consist of judgments, journals and reference materials in law areas of learning, teaching and research. Several important reference and citation analysis sources are also being subscribed by the University. The library regularly organizes orientation and literacy programmes for students for promoting the usage of e-resource. Users may contact the librarian for any additional help required while accessing the databases. Faculty Legal Services Programme

The Faculty has been running a Legal Services Programme since the early seventies. The main objectives of Legal Services Programme are to: (a) impart clinical legal education, (b) provide social service opportunities, and (c) impart socially relevant legal education. The Faculty has a comprehensive programme for clinical legal education. The Faculty has been organizing Legal Aid and Awareness programmes regularly in Delhi and adjacent areas.

The Moot Court competitions, debates, Client Counselling and group discussions (GD) are organized regularly in all the Centres of the Faculty. The students did their best in the Moot Court competitions organized in different parts of the country and won many prestigious awards.

Prizes, Medals, Scholarships

The students of LL.B. and LL.M. are eligible for a number of prizes, medals, scholarships, etc. offered by the University. The prizes include the University Law Union Prizes, Sukhdevi Girdharilal Grover Prize and Professor P.G. Krishnan Memorial Prize. The scholarships/fellowships include Post-Graduate scholarship, Dr. Ram Kishore Memorial Scholarship, Vijay Kumar Chadha Memorial Scholarship, National Scholarships, C. Rai Barrister of Sialkot Memorial Scholarship, Nain Sukh Gauba and Devi Huti Gauba Memorial Scholarship and Justice Sunanda Bhandare Fellowship in Constitutional Law. The medals include Dr. Shanker Dayal Sharma Gold Medal, Professor L.R. Sivasubramanian Gold Medal and Justice Sunanda Bhandare Gold Medal in Family Law. Besides the above, financial assistance is also given to deserving and needy students out of Vice-Chancellor's Student Fund. There is also provision for sizarships. Detailed information can be obtained from the Registrar, University of Delhi, Delhi.

The University has also received donation for institution of Sohan Lal Sethi Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship shall consist of Rs. 25,000/- in cash to the student securing highest marks in LL.B. I, II, III, IV and V Term Examination in each year.
