### Criteria for short listing and final selection of PGDM and PGDCM candidates for 2012-2014 Batch

#### Stage I :

Candidates will be shortlisted based on CAT score and academic performance provided they achieve the following minimum section-wise and overall CAT 2011 percentile scores:

**Table 1 : Cut-off Percentile for short-listing in the GDPI process**

Category	Section – I	Section – II	Overall
OPEN	$\geq 90$	$\geq 90$	$\geq 95$
NC-OBC	$\geq 75$	$\geq 75$	$\geq 85$

#### Stage II :

Total score of a candidate will be computed out of 100, the break-up of which is given in Table 1 below:

**Table 2 : Criteria and break-up of total score**

Criterion	Weightage
CAT score	<b>80%</b>
SSC marks	<b>10%</b>
HSC marks	<b>10%</b>
Total score	<b>100%</b>

1. For SSC and HSC marks, scores will be awarded out of five points for each based on Table 3 below. The marks obtained by candidates will be rounded to the nearest integers:

**Table 3 : SSC/HSC marks and respective scores**

<b>SSC/HSC marks (%)</b>	<b>Points</b>
81 and above	<b>5</b>
76 to 80	<b>4</b>
71 to 75	<b>3</b>
66 to 70	<b>2</b>
60 to 65	<b>1</b>
Less than or equal to 59	<b>0</b>

Shortlisted candidates based on the above criteria will be appearing for the GDPI which also has a written component. The shortlisting will be based on merit in each category, minimum qualification on the above mentioned criteria would not automatically shortlist the candidate for the next level.

**Criteria for Final Selection for PGDM & PGDCM (Batch 2011-13)**

The following table indicates the criteria and their weights to be used for final selection for PGDM and PGDCM for the batch 2012-14

**Table 4 : Criteria and weights for final selection for PGDM & PGDCM**

<b>Criterion</b>	<b>Weight</b>
CAT Score	<b>35%</b>
Group Discussion	<b>8%</b>
Writing Ability Test (WAT)	<b>7%</b>
Personal Interview	<b>40%</b>
Post Graduation, Professional qualification such as CA, ICWA and Company Secretary*	<b>2%</b>
Work Experience	<b>8%</b>
Total	<b>100%</b>

\*Points will be awarded to candidates, who have already completed or will be completing their post graduate/professional qualification by 31st January, 2012.

For work experience, a maximum of eight marks will be awarded depending on the length of service as on 31 January, 2012. Only managerial work experience after graduation will be considered. Training/Project work/work done as an integral part of curricular requirement will not be considered.

The final selection list will be based on merit in each category; minimum qualification on the above mentioned criteria would not automatically qualify the candidate for admission in to IIMC.
