Criteria for short listing and final selection of PGDM and PGDCM candidates for 2012-2014 Batch

## Stage I:

Candidates will be shortlisted based on CAT score and academic performance provided they achieve the following minimum section-wise and overall CAT 2011 percentile scores:

Table 1: Cut-off Percentile for short-listing in the GDPI process

## Stage II:

Total score of a candidate will be computed out of 100, the break-up of which is given in Table 1 below:

Table 2: Criteria and break-up of total score

Criterion	Weightage
CAT score	80%
SSC marks	10%
HSC marks	10%
Total score	100%

1. For SSC and HSC marks, scores will be awarded out of five points for each based on Table 3 below. The marks obtained by candidates will be rounded to the nearest integers:

Table 3: SSC/HSC marks and respective scores

SSC/HSC marks (%)	Points
81 and above	5
76 to 80	4
71 to 75	3
66 to 70	2
60 to 65	1
Less than or equal to 59	0

Shortlisted candidates based on the above criteria will be appearing for the GDPI which also has a written component. The shortlisting will be based on merit in each category, minimum qualification on the above mentioned criteria would not automatically shortlist the candidate for the next level.

## Criteria for Final Selection for PGDM & PGDCM (Batch 2011-13)

The following table indicates the criteria and their weights to be used for final selection for PGDM and PGDCM for the batch 2012-14

Table 4: Criteria and weights for final selection for PGDM & PGDCM

Criterion	Weight
CAT Score	35%
Group Discussion	8%
Writing Ability Test (WAT)	7%
Personal Interview	40%
Post Graduation, Professional qualification such as CA, ICWA and Company Secretary*	2%
Work Experience	8%
Total	100%

<sup>\*</sup>Points will be awarded to candidates, who have already completed or will be completing their post graduate/professional qualification by 31st January, 2012.

For work experience, a maximum of eight marks will be awarded depending on the length of service as on 31 January, 2012. Only managerial work experience after graduation will be considered. Training/Project work/work done as an integral part of curricular requirement will not be considered.

Table 5: Scores for work experience in months

The final selection list will be based on merit in each category; minimum qualification on the above mentioned criteria would not automatically qualify the candidate for admission in to IIMC.
